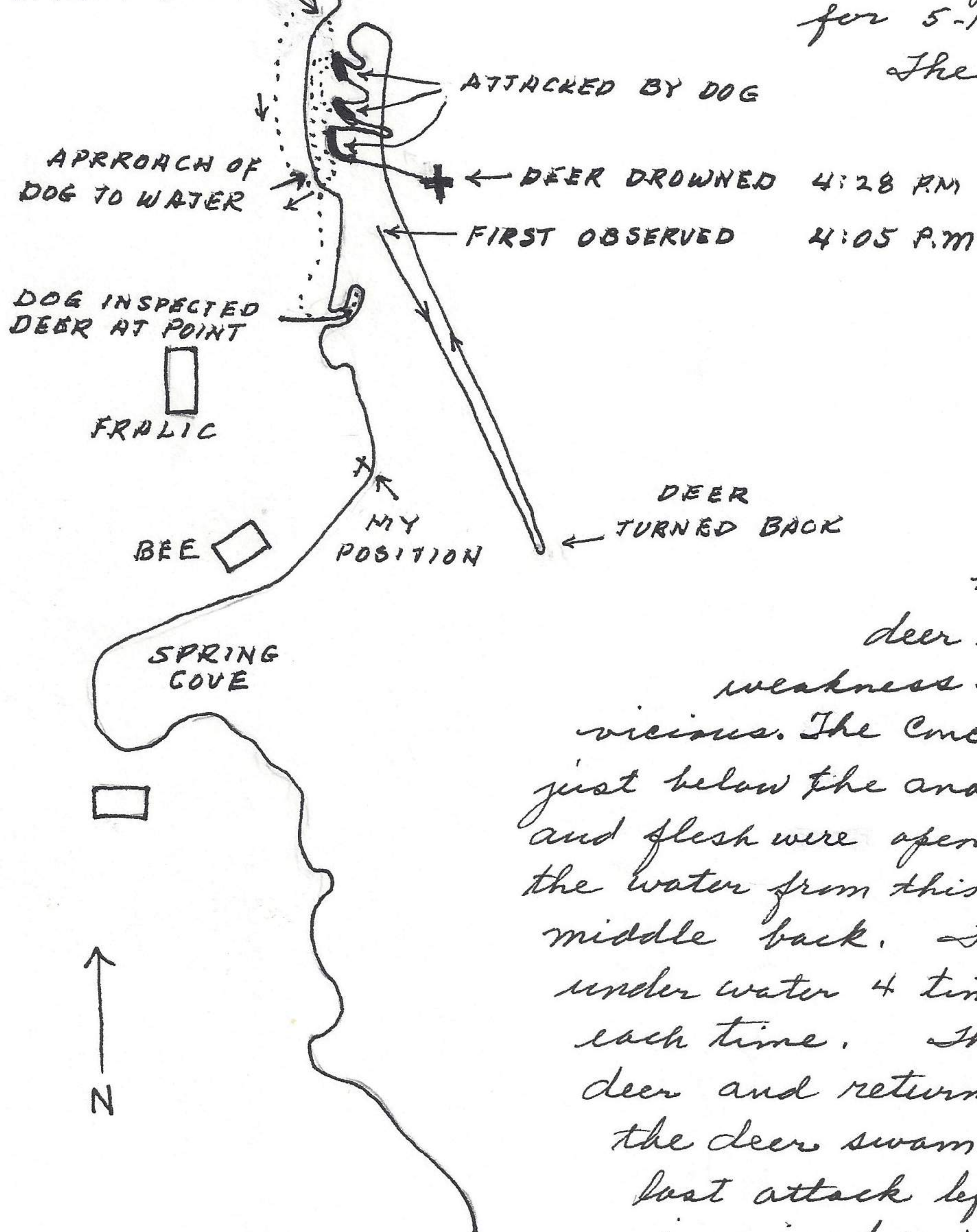


DEER
ATTACKED ON LAND.
THEN FELL TO
ROCKY SHORE
BELOW, ?



again swam out to intercept the deer.
The dog attacked from the rear of
deer and tore skin and muscle from
tail, hind quarters and lower
back, keeping deer under water
for 5-10 seconds at a time.

The deer turned SSW
again and swam
out to approx
80', stopped,
rested and
then returned
again toward
land to within
30' of shore
where it was

met by dog. The
deer showed signs of
weakness. This attack was
vicious. The concentration was
just below the anus where the skin
and flesh were opened. Blood colored
the water from this area and from
middle back. The deer was forced
under water 4 times for 5-15 second
each time. The dog left the
deer and returned to land while
the deer swam 150' SW. This
last attack left the deer with
impaired swimming. (left

hind legs non-functional) The pace was slow and irregular.
The last 20' ^{it} navigated with head under water half the time.
In 1 1/2 minutes after the deer stopped swimming it was
lifeless. Blood surrounded the body. at the moment the deer
drowned the dog appeared on yellow ridge n of Otter Cove. It
raced around the point, looked at the deer and then left
area.

Although I called several times the dog did
not respond. It was concluded that the dog first
attacked the deer on land that produced the tear on neck,
then the deer was forced or chose to jump off shoreline cliffs to
rocky beach below landing on left front legs & shoulder where
