

4:35 a small ♀, same size as sister, at feeder but ran to top of trail at lower parking area without stopping.

Boats that make most noise are large yachts that are exceeding their speed limits. High speed boats make considerable noise and motors that are need of repair & out of syne are noisy.

Dark-eyed juncos (♂ & ♀) are still feeding 3 young Cowbirds.

5:30 P.M. 62 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island, 12 of them on nests. A great blue heron alighted midway up on center of island, walked 20' in 10 minutes then laid down until at least 6:00 P.M. Great blue heron did not displace gulls.

5:55 Osprey flew W in Channel between Frost & Flower island toward Spence Spit. It did not displace the glaucous-wing gulls on Flower Island.

6:07 P.M. Ad. bald eagle on top Douglas fir (last tall tree on S end Frost Island before gentle slope to water at this moment another bald eagle flew W past the eagle perched on top tree. It was headed toward Swift Bay. GBH ^{left} _{up}.

6:30 P.M. in 1 hrs observation of gulls on Flower Island, 1 pair copulated and 2 pairs performed head bobbing action.

7:10 P.M. Sky Doe, a mule deer arrived at feeder at 6:30 P.M., fed for 9 minutes, left 80' to slope east of feeder, groomed body and finally left up trail above cliffs to path thence to parking lot, up trail to Frakes driveway then N to forest. This deer followed precisely the route of June 26, 1987. ("4" scar inside front heel) at 6:40 P.M.
