

Some shorelines without madronas.

In Friday Harbor checked Jensen Ship Building Marina at S end Friday Harbor. One motor boat 34-36, open, wood and glass all around (Jim Byers, 878-2609) "Isleña"; one boat, motor, floor step-up & down and not completely open, 34-36, wood, Gale Carter, 378-4542, "Sea Mini". good condition. Ray Slocomb of Jensen marina (iron fabricator) 378-5055 and showed us the boats, a good contact for knowledge of condition of boats.

On return from Friday Harbor to Lopez:

28 marbled murrelets, S of Shaw Island

42 glaucous-winged gulls feeding with marbled murrelets.

6 marbled murrelets E of Shaw Island

2 marbled murrelets N of Shaw.

At Orcas ferry terminal 12 ad. glaucous-winged gulls and 14 immature glaucous-winged gulls. noted 3 marbled murrelets fly 1' 1/2' above water in single file. Returned Lopez

7:45 P.M. at deer feeder Bee House, Shydae touched nose of Sister and then immediately repelled with thrust of front foot.

8:15 P.M. Shydae displaced Sister at feeder. Orphan a small mule deer (see notes July 5, 1987) displaced Shydae, later followed Shydae from area. (toward Lower Parking Lot). The young deer had no sign of spots and fur was ruffled and light. Whether it is an early born young of this year or later last year and a runt is questionable; more likely this year's fawn of Mamma Deer.

7:19 A.M. 4 river otter came around Lichen Point and passed Boundary Point at 7:38 A.M. or 19 minutes later. The entire time was hunting the shoreline as close (1'-4') as they could swim on or under the surface. They search back & forth thru the vegetation which was at low tide. The adult was larger and marked as follows:
