

This afternoon at 3:30 P.M. Annette & I with Jona to Anacortes to meet Marian Endicott for them to return to Lynnwood. Stayed Thousand Trails tonight. Rufous hummingbirds at feeder this afternoon

July 15, 1987

5:15 P.M. Left Anacortes on ferry for Lopez.

8:15 P.M. young ^{mule} deer 25" high at feeder. Named Skull Cap ♀ and condition of pelage ^{fuzzy}. This young deer has lost its spot and beginning to lose light fuzzy pelage and gain darker pelage. Its relationship is undecided at this time. Very shy and does not associate with any other adult ♀ mule deer as far as we have witnessed

July 16, 1987

8:00 A.M. adult eagle from Blakley E of us to N end of Humphrey Head and beyond.

11:45 A.M. photo 870716-1 of Skull Cap ♀, observed 8:15 P.M. yesterday evening.

July 17, 1987

9:12 P.M. 4 turkey vultures flying 60' above new cut field SE of junction Baker View and Port Stanley rds.

July 18, 1987

During the last week the rufous hummingbirds have gradually decreased from average of 3-6 to 1-2 at feeders. Sugar water level shows little use of food. There have not been male birds since last one observed (see last entry of male bird)

northern violet green swallow actively feeding young from a few minutes before sunrise to late dusk at the time bats first become active. One young in nest and one stay on top of nesting box, at least during the day but flies out from box on foraging trips.

Two adult bald eagles circled 110 feet above water in Swift Bay at 10:00 A.M.

Shy Doe and Teenie at feeder. This fawn in bracket spots is approximately 2 1/2" inches high or 1 1/2 x the height of the hind foot of the female doe. The fawn fed continuously from between the hind legs of doe while the doe fed 6 minutes at the feeder.
