1:53 P.M. Shipley's residence to W.

8 least sandpipers

at old boat haulout building cement barrier at head of beach to sandbar to E on beach 50'. Sandbar 20' (dry part) wide and 1 foot high in  barrier

2:04 P.M. 2 barn swallows,  sand bar  
dead admiral butterfly in water at edge.

2:11 P.M. Swift Bay Point at  
100' E of lone <sup>glacial</sup> erratic on beach.

2:12 P.M. 2 Odonata - (dragonfly) and first observed.

2:15 P.M. Sandy Point

2:24 P.M. Skeleton Point, 2 Odonata, leg of mule deer with hoof 65 mm long. No river otter <sup>tracks</sup> on beaches.

2:34 N Spencer Point.

2:38 Beginning of Sandy Flats.  
no insects on trip except 3 bees, 2 wasps and numerous small '1/8' black diptera (water edge).  
3 Odonata

2:46 Spencer Lagoon, 13 American crow, 2 northern green swallows over water, 5 greater yellowlegs, 8 western sandpipers. End of Complete Census.

Return to Bee House.

5:30 P.M. ♀ mule deer <sup>cervon</sup> at feeder (29" high) but not the one at 10:05 this A.M. This deer was feeding at feeder and a dark barked at O'Leary's residence. The deer from feeder can see & heard O'Leary's. It left feeder and ran full speed to top of Allen Trail Slope, stopped and looked over at O'Leary's for 3 minutes. Has eaten juniper, dry leaves madrone.

7:20 P.M. Mule deer (25" high at shoulders) with dark crown. (Skull Cap 4)

8:00 P.M. 76 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island, 13 American Crows, 1 cormorant. 8 Bonaparte gulls feeding on water 100' N of Island. Crows are feeding on island but cannot see that they are disturbing the gulls although I would expect them to take eggs or young if available.
