

July 26, 1987

8:05 A.M. 4 river otter to N and by-passing Spring Cove. Fishing along way. One searched shallow waters below Bee House for 25 seconds. When under water and probing vegetation there was a continuous flow of forcefully expelled air or bubbles.

9:10 A.M. ♀ rufous hummingbird at feeder. Wasp challenged the bird but bird evaded and returned to feeder. Bird left in 35 seconds to tree then left area. Last hummingbird for this year.

Before sunrise sound mirrorlike and no evidence of bird or fish activity ^{water} on. At these times it is easy see any activity of animals on the surface or just beneath surface.

9:20 A.M. Buster feed at feeder and came to window for hand fed apples. Cimbar last year was the most Confiding deer of family group but now will not come to hand fed situations whereas Buster has acquired the confidence to do so.

9:25 A.M. 2 great blue heron flew by to N. On return one alighted on top of Bee House and eastern gray squirrels and Townsend chipmunk scrambled off porch feeding area.

9:45 A.M. 25 harbor seal Leo Reef.

2:08 A.M. ♂ Dark-eyed junco fed young junco

2:10 A.M. Collected the following insect from Douglas fir at Bee House:

6:10 P.M. ad. bald eagle flew S, then 15 min. later a eagle (adult) flew N. The usual line of flight when eagle is not actively hunting is from Boundary Point to Lichen Point as an adult eagle flys directly away at eye level, the white tail is a conspicuous patch at rear of eagle.

July 27, 1987

8:15 A.M. 3 bald eagles flew N at 70' high above shoreline and interacting in flight.

Rufous hummingbird at feeder last evening but not this A.M. Feeder measures 1 1/2" below full marker.

Five different deer at feeder at one time or the other including Shy Doe, Skull Cap (a new name for young with conspicuous dark hair on top of head and Buster. Shy Doe makes
