Chevron, a mule deer, and fawn at feeder. Fawn 21" high at shoulders.

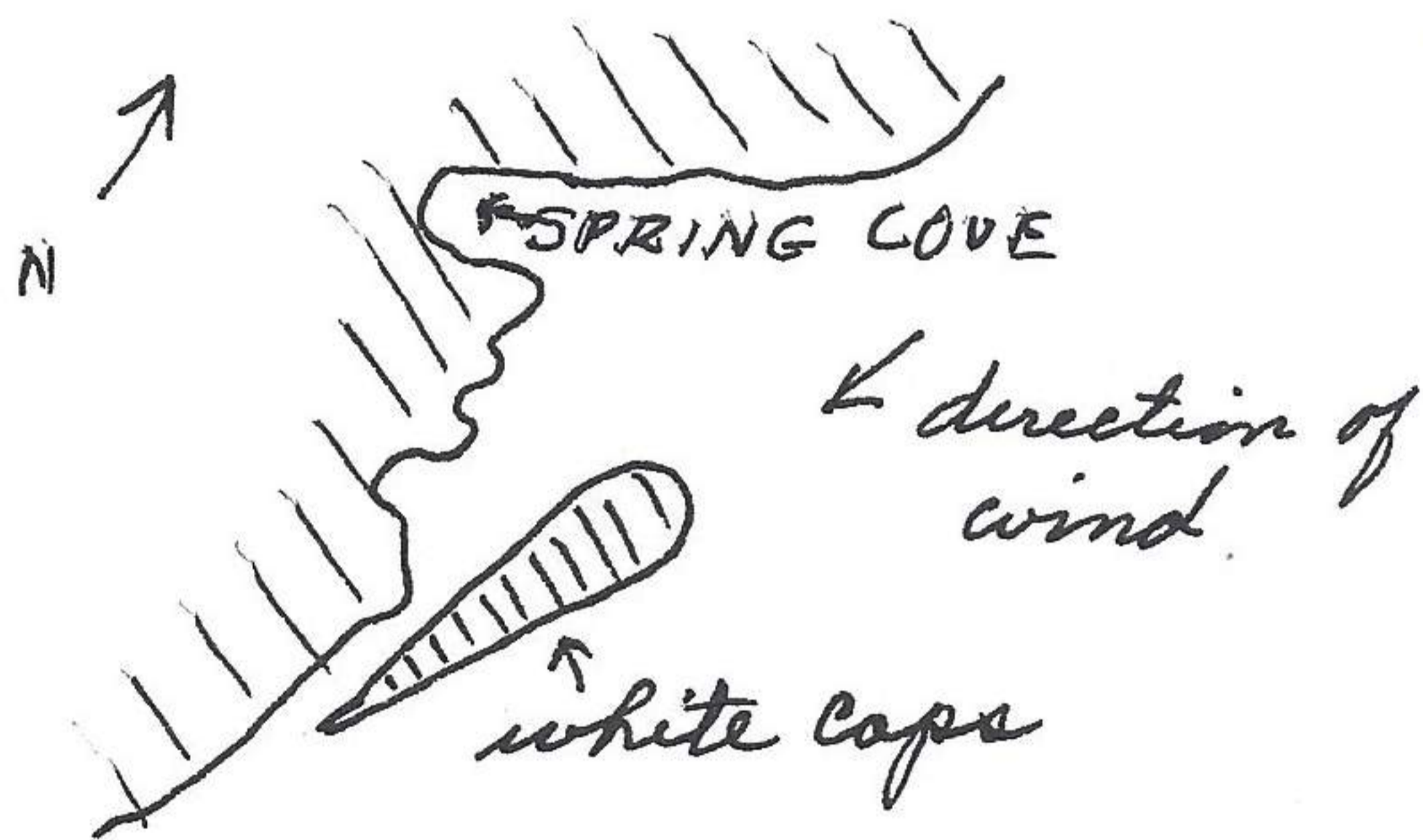
Buster, a mule deer, was on porch last night around 4:00 A.M. and 4:30 A.M. ate azaleas, pansetta, marigold. Crossed chair barrier. also jumps from porch to rocky cliffs.

9:45 A.M. Shy Doe, a mule deer at feeder.

10:20 A.M. Chevron and fawn at feeder. The doe spends considerable concentration attention to O'Learys who have a dog. She will frequently leave feeder and area, generally in a hurry.

This A.M. when currents were strong to the north around Lichen Point:

The wind from the north against the current cause localized white-caps.



12:00 P.M. One of mamma deer's twins (25 1/4" high at shoulders) <sup>which</sup>

6:00 P.M. Chevron, a mule deer, and fawn at feeder. <sup>O'Learys</sup>

6:30 P.M. A ♀ ad mule deer, new to area and fawn at <sup>sear</sup> feeder. <sup>ad.</sup> (30 1/4") "new girl" (20 1/2") Fawn with anterior body without spots, rear half with spots. A dark hair line (2") down dorsal neck, (4") down dorsal back to rump. Line extends between ears and all of top of head. 2 exposures of antler buds which seems unusual for a deer of this size. However, antlerlike base occur on ♀'s.


Aug 21, 1987

Water in sound smooth. no birds between Leo Reef & Bee House

7:00 A.M. one of mamma deer's twins at feeder.

9:50 A.M. Chevron, a mule deer, at feeder.

9:55 A.M. Buster, a mule deer, has hair from lashes a area immediately associated with eye 3" long.
