acted like hawking nighthawks coming up to a peak in air
and then dropping back or down again. At Shaw ferry terminal,
12 ad. glaucous-winged gulls on piling. Harney Channel 25
glaucous-winged gulls following a dredging fish boat. Also 3
Bonaparte gulls in area.

Purser of ferry said ferry cruise approx 16 MPR. Returned
to Lopez.

7:40 P.M. flying termites with wings approx 20 mm long passed upwards
in front of windows at Bee House. At about same time 54
Bonaparte gulls in groups of 4-8 passed by to S and as each group
came into the area, they circled and fed on these termites for 2 or
3 minutes then continued S. The general area of hawking was
approx 60' to 250' high and 100-300' S of shoreline. The gulls
continued hawking the area until 8:28 P.M., the termites 8:34 P.M.
Hawking was associated with fast fluttering of wings and peaking
at level of height of termites wind from N carried termites out (S) and
upward. One specimen of above termites is no. 870822-1
