To Friday Harbor at 11:00 A.M. Enroute observed 2 Bonaparte gulls in Harney Channel, 26 Bonaparte gulls in one flock in Upright Channel. 1 glaucous-winged gull in San Juan Channel. 1 glaucous-winged gull by Turn Island. Friday Harbor.

9. 3 blade replaced by 4 blade propeller.
10. Cruised SE Alaska many times from Sitka, Glacier Bay, Juneau and points S. Never used on main ocean but rides swells easily. Watch out when swells are cresting.
11. Idyle below 5 knots creates motor vibration as is true with most diesel motors. Ruth has paintings of Denali, Glacier Bay etc.

Left Shaw 13 Bonaparte gulls, 16 Bonaparte gulls, 2 Bonaparte gulls, 5 Bonaparte gulls, now E end Harney Channel. At Lopez ferry landing,
