

7 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 imm. Arrived 7:26 P.M.

August 24, 1987

8:30 A.M. Chevron, a mule deer, and <sup>new</sup> fawn at feeder. Buster arrived but was displaced by Chevron. Fawn aggressively tried to suckle female and finally caused ♀ to leave with fawn but denied fawn food. Chevron later returned to feeder and was compatible with Buster, both heads in feeder.

9:20 A.M. Shy doe at feeder.

3:00 P.M. To Richardson. Fog 1-2 miles inland, clear beyond to N. They claim this condition has occurred all day.

at SW end Fisherman's Bay: 55 glaucous-winged gulls, 13 Bonaparte gulls, 6 semipalmated plovers, 7 great blue herons, 3 killdeer, 1 least sandpiper?

6:10 P.M. new Girl, a mule deer, and fawn at feeder.

new Girl Aug 25, 1987

7:45 A.M. a large ♀ <sup>(29")</sup> and fawn at feeder. Scar (<sup>anterior</sup> 1/4")-medial right hind leg half way between heel and foot.

8:00 A.M. Harbor seal 6' from shore below Bee House.

9:05 A.M. 4 river otter, all dark, from Lichen Point to Dissected Point, bypass Spring Bay to Bee House to beyond Boundary Point. They trailed 10'-20' apart and fished entire way catching black, white, orange fish approx. 6" long.

10:20 17 harbor seal Leo Reef.

8 " " n Flower Rack

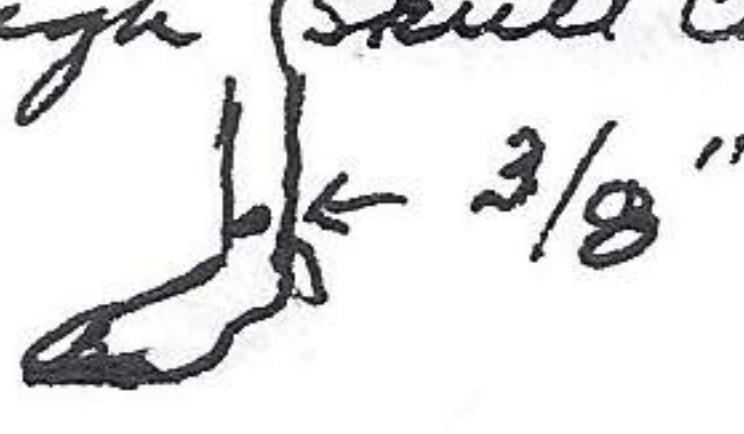
53 glaucous-winged gulls Flower Island.

8 double-crested cormorant fishing 100' n Leo Reef.

no gulls on Leo Reef.

10:30 Sister, 27".

11:00 Extremely shy deer (27") and fawn.

11:10 One of mamma deer twins, 25" high (skull cap 8) with scar on exterior left leg above dew claw.  3/8"

11:40 Twin no ♂ back to feeder.

11:50 Chevron, a mule deer (29") & fawn.

4:00 P.M. Skull Cap ♀ <sup>a mule deer</sup> at feeder. Had been lying on deer <sup>Trail</sup> slope previous 1/2 hr. It is very weak, emaciated especially in hip area with top pelvis prominent. Stomach bloated, holds head down, feces green and compact with large individual pellets, rear legs angled and unstable when walking.
