

4:30 P.M. 2 surf birds (*Aphriza virgata*) along shore below Bee Sauce. They fed at water edge and moved ⁿ along rocky shore.

8:00 P.M. 91 gull-winged gulls Flower Island just as sun rays left the island, 2 marked murrelet 200' n of Flower Island. 42 surf birds? on extreme NE end Flower Island.

Aug 26, 1987

9:35 new Girl, a mule deer and fawn at feeder. Dark pelage on top head, neck and stripe down ^(22 1/2") back. ^{old pelage bright reddish.} Fawn, more new hair, ^{showing} on top head, neck and shoulders. Maintaining original spots so far. Both left to NW

12:15 new Girl, a mule deer and fawn at feeder. Ad nosed Skull Cap ^{no. 2 ♀} for 4 secs. then chased away.

2:00 P.M. Skull Cap ♂ at feeder and considerably more incapacitated than yesterday. Abdomen more distended. Returned to Bench Forest beyond Boundary Point.

5:30 P.M. Chevron at feeder alone.

Aug 27, 1987

7:10 P.M. Skull Cap ♀ at feeder. 25" high at shoulders.

7:30 P.M. Chevron & fawn at feeder.

7:35 P.M. Sky Doe at feeder, dent in hair front leg above wrist 3".

7:40 P.M. Sky Doe back to feed, no fawn.

Aug. 28, 1987

10:00 AM at Lower Parking Lot, a sharp-shinned hawk, unsuccessfully tried to capture a pileated woodpecker, yellow-shafted flicker and a band-tailed pigeon. When the hawk was first observed it was chasing one of three band-tailed pigeons, they all left the area. Twenty seconds later the hawk chased 1 of 4 yellow-shafted flicker evaded the hawk by flying a circular route at tree tops and then returned to the upright member of Twin Firs where it joined ^{3 yellow-shafted flickers} other and a pileated woodpecker. 1 minute later the hawk chased a second pileated woodpecker approx. 50 feet to another Douglas fir tree. The sharp-shinned hawk then left the area to the northwest. None of these larger birds demonstrated excessive fear of this small predator.
