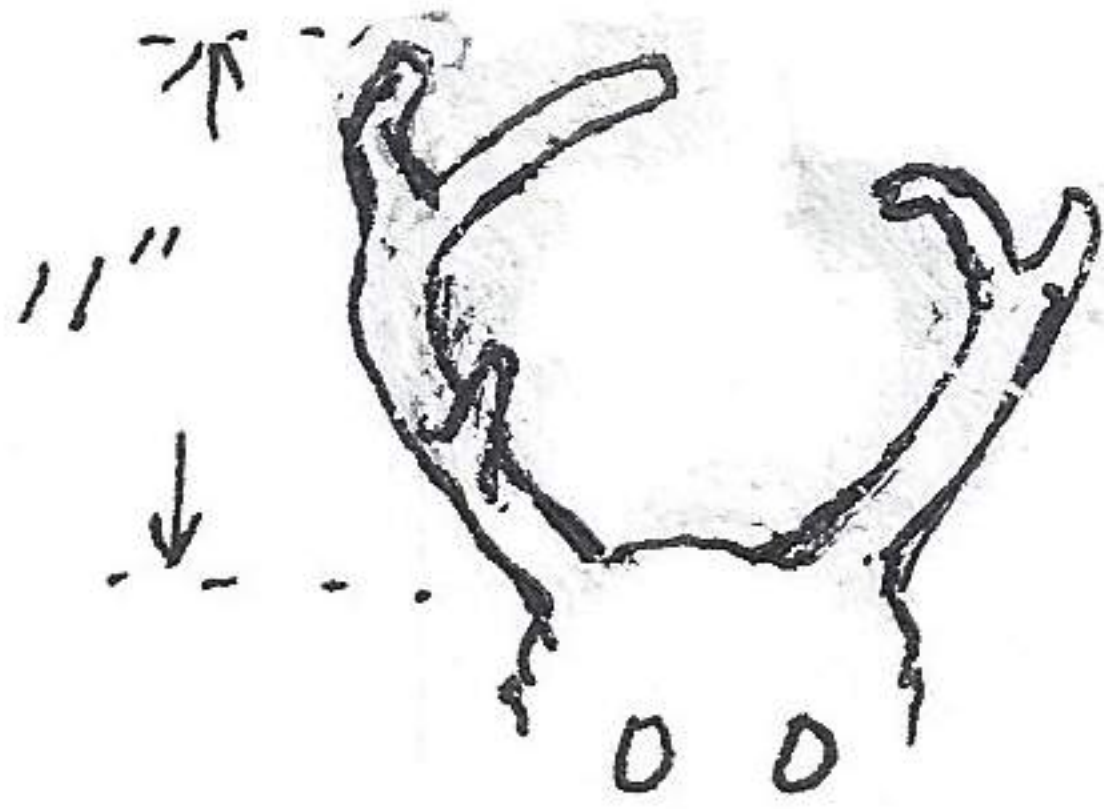


Douglas fir they showed complete compatibility a least up to 3" interval.

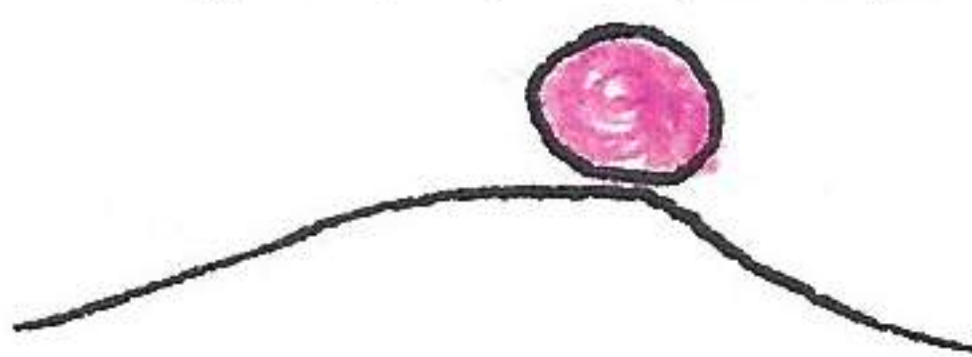
