Indian fishermen and boats still in area, 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 2 Bonaparte gulls, 2 Bonaparte gulls, 2 Bonaparte gulls, 1 Bonaparte gull, 8 Bonaparte gulls in rip tides supporting vegetational debris. Friday Harbor 12:10 P.M. To Roche Harbor for lunch. Barn swallows nesting or at least flying in and out under restaurant, 3 glaucous-winged gulls in harbor. Check with Mr. Benson of Cove Marina for survey of Isleño and with Mr. Albert Jensen for haulout of boat. Returned to Lopez.

Wind changed and now from S this early morning accompanied by slight rain

Left for Anacortes 7:30 A.M. at Pointer Island glaucous-winged gulls every 3-4' apart and generally distributed. Entire surface of island covered with white excrement whereas pre-nesting the S end of island is the area of white surfacing. 3/10 mi. S Pointer Island 280 Bonaparte gulls in one flying group. 3 glaucous-winged gulls in Rosario Straits. The numbers of gulls enroute is determined by time of day and stage of currents. Arrived Anacortes ferry Terminal 8:43 A.M.

To Mt. Vernon, then return to Anacortes. At 7:00 P.M. left Anacortes ferry terminal. In Rosario Straits 12 glaucous-winged gulls, 18 Bonaparte gulls flying SW, 15 individual glaucous-winged gulls enroute. Also 1 cormorant (double-crested), 6 glaucous-winged gulls flying NW and another single glaucous-winged gull flying NW, all S of Pointer Island. 1 glaucous-winged gull flying E at W end Thatcher Pass.
