Oct. 23, 1987

1:30 P.M. 82 double-crested cormorant, 9 glaucous-winged gulls and 31 harbor seal on Leo Reef. On Flower Island no gulls but 2 American crows. 1 horned grebe and 1-3 western grebes feed in front of Bee House.

3:20 P.M. In front Bee House 4 western grebes, 9 juveniles and 1 ad. Bonaparte and 2 glaucous-winged gulls fed about 100' from shore. Another group approx. 300' from shore of 18 Bonaparte and 3 glaucous-winged gulls, 4 double-crested cormorant and 1 western grebe

5:00 P.M. ♂ mule deer (G) at Bee feeder, 33" high at shoulders, no ^{eye} tine left antler. Fed 3-5' from 2 fawns.

1 river otter past S out 10' from shore below Bee House.

Oct. 24, 1987

Nine mule deer including 2 males interested in ♀, fed at Bee feeder from 1/2 hr. before sunrise to 9:30 A.M. One 4 point ♂ mule deer stood immobile at a vantage point and concentrated in looking beyond area for 20 minutes.

11:30 A.M. a 4 point mule ♂ deer followed a ♀ for 150' at a fast run keeping about 30' behind.

2:30 P.M. a 4 point mule deer at feeder at Bee House and only deer in area.

Oct. 25, 1987

Today maximum yellow in all deciduous trees on W side Blakely Island. First color change approx. 7 weeks ago. Some trees show beginning of fading.

Mr. John Saul of Humphrey Head on Lopez Island reports: "Raccoons at his home have been there all summer." At the Bee House feet from Sauls home we have not seen them except an occasional track in trail.

11:00 A.M. "Ram" a mule deer at Bee feeder

12:20 A.M. 26 harbor seal and 37 cormorant on Leo Reef. As high tide progressively cover the reef, they move to the platform of Leo Reef beach. One jinks at feeder had brown on top head whereas rest of black-eyed jinks the head is black.

2:15 P.M. Adult bald eagle alighted tree (Douglas fir) above Lechen Point. (See May 5, 1987).
