Nov. 9, 1987

Fawn of the year mule deer approached an eastern gray squirrel to 14" and inspected it for several seconds (10).

A <sup>N-S</sup>raft of feeding Bonaparte gulls, approx 800, occupied an area of 50' x 300', in middle of N Lopez Sound between Bee House and fault line directly E on Blakely Island. Wind from S.

Nov. 10, 1987

7:30 A.M. Light pelaged ad. female mule deer (27" high at shoulders) and fawn fed at Bee House feeder. Both left uphill where they met another female 26" high and a ♂ fawn of the year. The female going up grade charged ♂ which was 15" up hill. The ♂ reared on hind legs and walked upright 3 steps in response. The charging ♀ stopped charge and with her young continued uphill. The other 2 continued down slope to feeder.

7:45 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull passed S past Bee House.

7:59 A.M. Ad. bald eagle E to S. 15 glaucous-winged gulls have moved S.

Color of deciduous trees above Fault Line on W side Blakely are: 1 yellow, 4 leafless, 6 faded gold to brown. Trees at N end Blakely E-S-S airstrip, from green to yellow to golden, to brown to leafless.

7:27 A.M. 45 cormorant Les Reef plus 8 glaucous-winged gulls and 2 harbor seals.

7:30 A.M. instant fog developed in 150' zone along Blakely and Necker Islands. at 8:00 A.M. all N and as far S in Lopez Sound in fog. 7 hufflehead alighted in fog in front Bee House out 30' from shore, all ♀'s
