a male mule deer with total 4 points and 2 eye tines with height at shoulders $35\frac{1}{2}$ inches and left lower edge of ear with large nick. more interested in food at feeder at Bee House than females. Displaced one adult ♀ and then fed on crooked corn. Buster a ♀ mule deer was displaced by a large female. Later a fawn of year alone at feeder.

Photo 871116-1 of "Ram" a ♂ mule deer $33\frac{1}{2}$ " high at shoulders. Photo 871116-2 also of this deer.

Color of deciduous trees on Blakely Island S of airport gone except reddish dead leaves and some faint color remnants of yellow and yellow-green.

4:10 varied thrush, killed flying into window of Bee House. (E back door). Measurements only: T.L. 237 mm, wing 125, tail 85, foot 62, tarsus 34, bill 19, ^{72 gms, wing spread 381.}

6:32 P.M. ♂ mule deer with 2 prongs, one side deformed and only one eye tine (right side).

6:41 P.M. Song sparrow, 871116-4, killed by flying into window of Bee House. T.L. 160 mm, 26 gms.

Nov. 17, 1987

6:36 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull called.

6:49 A.M. first bald eagle (ad.) flew S past Bee House. Fog in S Lopez Sound.

7:11 A.M. ad. bald eagle flew N past Bee House.

7:30 Fog now into N Lopez Sound from S Lopez Sound.

Nov. 18, 1987

2:35 P.M. 7 river otter swam N past Bee House. The direction is NE but most frequently stated as N. 2 of the otter left the group and entered Spring Cove where they put-out on beach, the rest continued to in front Bee House where they fed on candlefish from 5' to 30' out from shore. dives were 100% successful. They remained here for 5 minutes then left NE for 50' but returned to area of candlefish concentration where they fished for $1\frac{1}{2}$ min. the NE again.

Nov. 20, 1987

Nov. 21, 1987

3 bald eagles (all adults) sighted this A.M.
