6:56 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull past Bee House, then to  
7:20 A.M. groups of 1, 6, 5, 2, 3, 1, 6, 2 past by, all going S toward Swift Bay.

'Ram' at feeder this A.M. mule deer active at night, heard 6 times. Hungry this A.M. and ate 2 gallons standard scratch. Mule deer have 2 main feeding periods, one from daybreak to about 9:30 A.M. and from about 4:00 to 7:00 P.M., although they may be at feeder at any time of the day but these are exceptional. Observed the first mule deer on Klein property since 1985 because of a deer running dog. The dog was recently removed from Humphrey Head.

Nov 24, 1987

7:00 A.M. first glaucous-winged gull today. Groups of 2, 1, 1, 1 in next 5 min, groups 6, 4, 2 in next 5 min, groups 1, 2, 1, 3, 1 in next 5 min, 20 in next 10 min. Gulls of above all flying S at approx. 8 per 5 min for at least next hour. Average 70' above water and 20'-50' from shore below Bee House.

Flat Point covered at 9.5'. Wind all last night and today.

Nov. 25, 1987

7:02 A.M. First glaucous-winged gull flying N past Bee House. Only 2 gulls in next 10 min. no bald eagles.

Nov. 26, 1987

7:30 A.M. 32 floating logs between Lichen Point and Boundary Point where currents carry them in direct line. They vary from 3" x 7' to 18" x 30'. Also approx 15 pieces of wood under minimum size above generally 2" x 2'.
