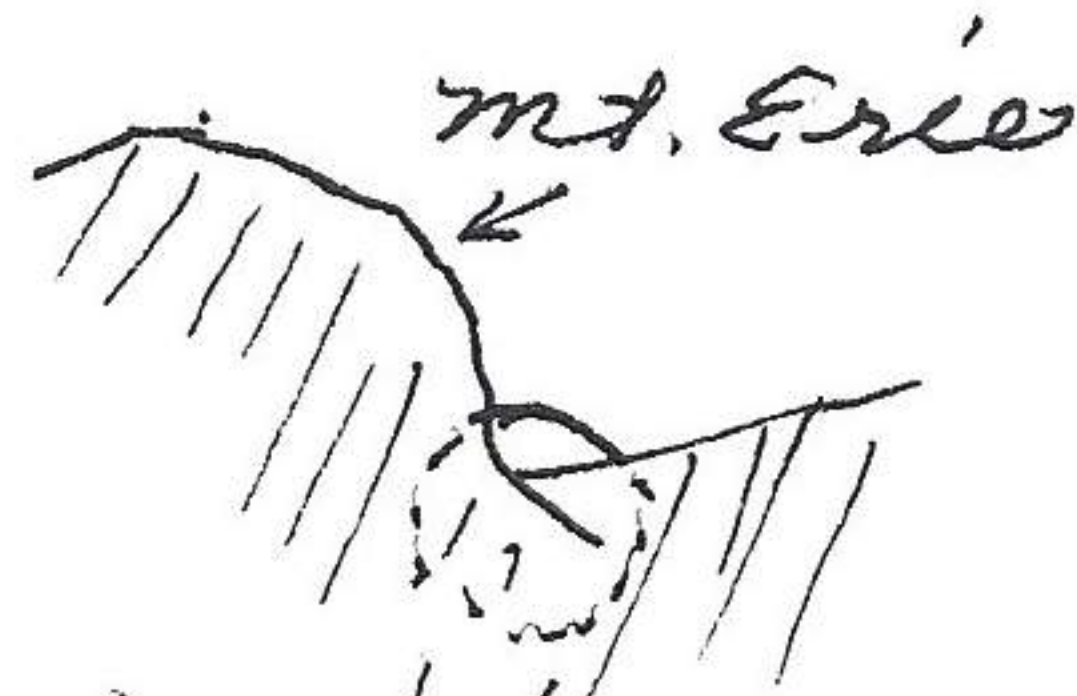
Approx 160 Bonaparte gulls and 60 glaucous-winged gulls NE Frost Island to Flower Island.

971130-1 wasp from Bee House. Two others observed near by.

Waves 26 per minute, white-capped and foam trails from direction of wind.

No Townsend chipmunks since last recorded.

4 ad. females and 2 yearlings at Bee feeder.

Three bald eagle sightings today at Bee House.

No Cowbirds this season so far.

8:10 A.M. Adult bald eagle flew S past Bee House. Rain all last night.

Left 300 birds of which 95% were glaucous-winged gulls. Others Bonaparte gull, mew gulls, double-crested cormorants, common murrelets and marbled murrelets.

8:20 A.M. 65 Bonaparte gulls feed 10 to 50' apart in front Bee House
