Jan 16, 1988

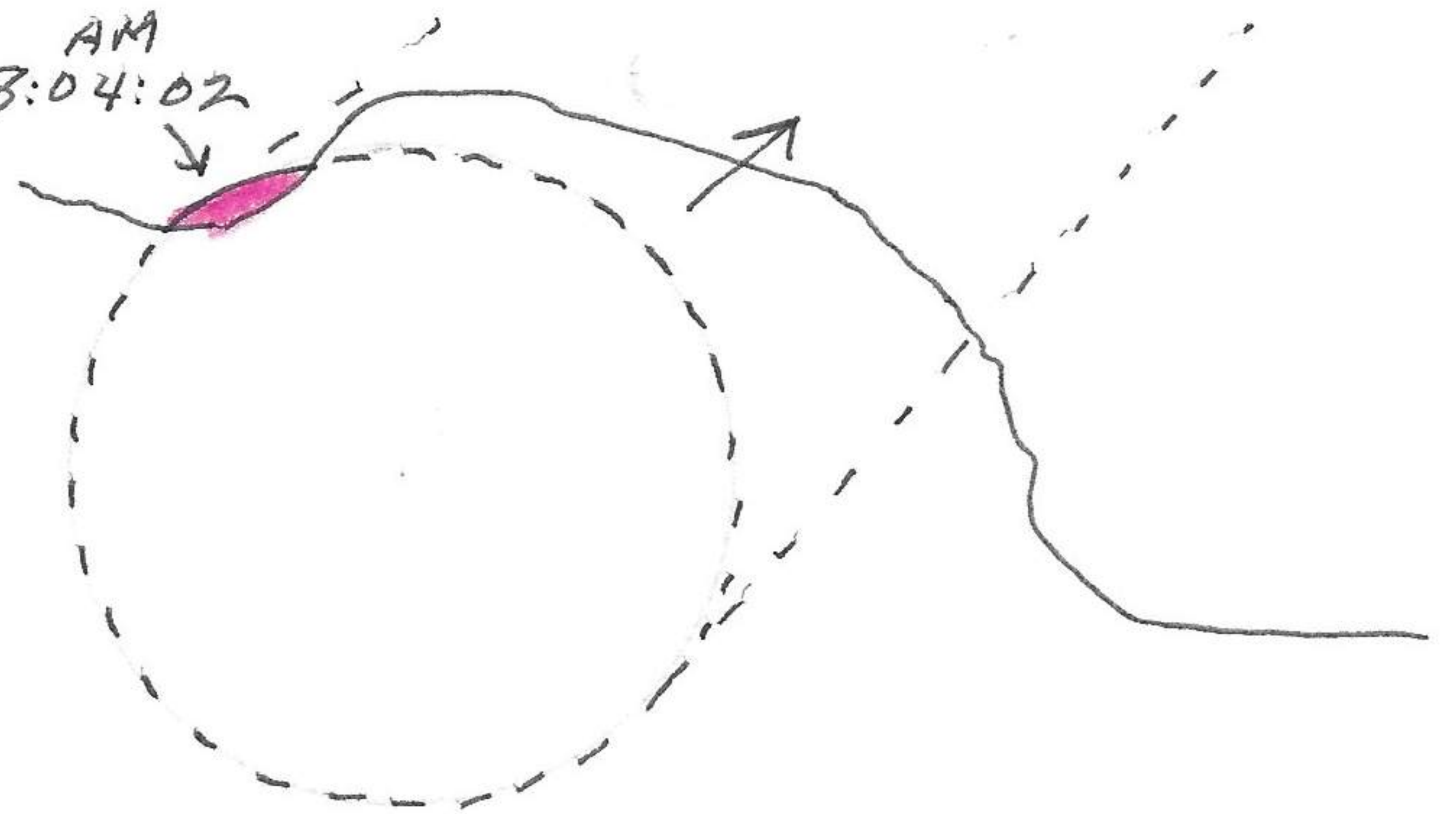
7:45 AM 8 bald eagles in air at one time. For last week the sightings average 5 (3-8) per day.

8:05 AM adult bald eagle on shore rocks below Bee House. It left and flew out 20', picked up a 10" fish and flew to Flat Point Tree.

Jan 17, 1988

8:04:02 AM. Sun up on mt. Erie.

8 bald eagles flew NS in front Bee House at about 40' high between 7:20 AM and 8:20 AM.



Jan 19, 1988

880119-1 *Peromyscus m. holisteri* 176-81-23-18-24 gms ♀

7 bald eagles flew by Bee House average 60' above water and 50' out from shore, between 7:30 AM and 8:00 AM.

Jan 20, 1988

8:45 AM. ad. bald eagle on shoreline rocks, 3 feet from water, below Bee House, left to 150' SE, displaced 13 mew gulls and 5 double-crested cormorants who were fishing in an area of 8' x 10'. The eagle sailed to fishing area, dropped with fully extended legs and displaced water 1/2 way of body. It lifted off water and with extended clinched talons flew to Boundary Point Tree (3/4 up tree). If a fish was taken it was too small to see. Four minutes later, after gulls & cormorants had reemerged over ball of candlefish, the eagle slowly dropped to fishing area and repeated.
