

Swift Bay. The eagle previously perched on Leo Reef beam did not participate and remained on beam to at least 2:40 P.M. All birds and mammals participated in fishing in the red mass area. At 2:50 P.M. the three ad. eagles still in their perching areas (beam, Boundary and Lichen points). The loons, murres, marble murrelets in periphery area. The fishing activity lasted from 2:08 P.M. to 2:18 P.M. or 10 minutes.

3:00 P.M. 18 harbor seal on Leo Reef.

Single Tyne, a mule deer 34 1/4" at shoulders at feeder this evening as it has been in last 5 days. Antler base approx 1 inch diameter at bony skull level. Color of base light gray and wavy texture of surface. It fed with Buster, also a mule deer.

4:20 P.M. 3 river otter toward me to 20' when I was at edge of water below Bee House. A single sharp whistle was given at various positions but not certain whether given by the same individual.

A large ♀ mule deer at feeder, measuring 31" at shoulder. It was unusually aggressive.

Jan 26, 1988

First bold eagle this AM at 7:10. Between 7:10 AM and 8:00 AM. 7 sightings of bold eagles but not know if some repetitive.

8:10 AM 6 glaucous-winged gulls over fish ball 150' SE of Lichen Point. Then 12 more and then 42 gulls including 6 mew gulls in the next 2 minutes.

8:12 AM. In same area as above fish ball, the double-crested cormorant increase from 1 to 8 birds. Also a red-necked loon arrived. An immature bold eagle flew to area from N and all gull retreated to 100'-200'. The eagle passed over the area and then all gulls returned.

8:15 AM An imm. bold eagle returned to fish ball, circled 6 times but did not enter water. The gulls (glaucous-winged and mew gull) also circled close to eagle (10'-30' above water) but after eagle left only 1/4 of the gulls remained and the others dispersed to 200'-300' beyond where the cormorants had retreated. The aquatic birds did not return to fish ball area. The eagle left and alighted in Douglas fir on Boundary Point.

8:50 AM. Harbor seal swam by Bee House.

An adult bold eagle rested on Leo ^{Reef} beam from 9:10 AM to 9:20 AM.

10:50 AM The light doe (29 1/2" at shoulders) feed with 2 fawns also light pelage (one measured 25 1/4" at shoulders).
