

Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Wa
 march 1, 1988

at 1/2 mi. n junction Center and Shell roads observed an imm. bald eagle with 3 primary feathers missing.

Left Lopez at 2:40 P.M. for Anacortes and ^{La Conner} Thousand Trails at Lopez Ferry landing the Keateh. broom had 120 yellow flowers on one bush. First ones noticed one week ago. One immature bald eagle left a tree E of ^{upper} ferry parking lot.

(Don and his family left this A.M.) We left 2:40 as stated above. Fog 5 mi visibility. Birds observed. 6 double-crested cormorant at terminal. no eagle of nest at n end Humphrey Head.
