Left T.T. and drove to 13095 Anacortes St in Burlington. Across street to east 152 trumpeter swans, 256 american widgeons, 24 American crows and 1 marsh hawk. I approached swam from main road for 200 feet before the swans all stood upright and started to walk away from me. They were at that time 200 feet away. As I watched they settled down and half of them again came to rest on the grass. I left and they did not react.

Left Burlington and drove back to Anacortes. at junctions 536 and 20 noted a redtail.

Arrived Anacortes ferry terminal. noted a boat seining for fish and it left but 45 glaucous-winged gulls remained in area for the next 1/2 hour.

Birds in area:

5 ♀, 2 ♂ greater scaup. They remained in some area near terminal along beach (20' out) for 1 1/2 hrs.

4 glaucous-winged gulls, mainly on piling at terminal, 70 on piling in W end of bay.

1 red-necked grebe

2 bufflehead.

1 common loon

2 double-crested cormorant.

2 American crows.

Left on ferry 5:20 P.M. Will keep list of birds along way. (on side boat) and out to 1/10 mile.)
