

7:45 A.M. adult ♀ mule deer (light pelage) at 29 inches high at shoulder, and her twins of last year, 25 and 26 inches respectively, at feeder. Both young with light pelage at rear. The smallest, a male, is not as in good health as twin. ad. pregnant.

9:10 A.M. adult bald eagle alighted on indentation (drainage between Round Point and Flat Point. In the 2 minutes it was there 12 American crows arrived and remained in immediate area, one within 8 feet of eagle. The eagle then flew up to Flat Point and onto drift logs between Flat Point and Dissected Point. One glaucous-winged gull, imm. viewed the eagle from Dissected Point only 20' away. As the eagle would leave one spat for another, 2 crows immediately check exact spot where eagle had placed its feet and would pick up particles left from the feet of the eagle. The eagle left and flew 5 around Lichen Point.

11:30 A.M. 7 ♀ and 5 ♂ Common mergansers in front Bee House.

11:45 A.M. above mergansers all left to E to join a group of 17 double-crested cormorants and 6 glaucous-winged gulls in fishing activity. At that same moment an imm. bald eagle flew 10' over them but did not remain in area.

6:15 P.M. 3 ^{male} deer fed at feeder. Single Tyne (34 1/4") with top of antler bud level + smooth, Ram with upper surface of antler base concave , and an unknown buck, 33" high at shoulders with top of antler base concave in center . Raven at 6:00 P.M. calling from W end Bee Estate.

8:30 A.M. River after swimming to ^{March 11, 1988} past Bee House

To Lopez Village and Richardson in afternoon: at Humphrey Logans 6 bufflehead, 4 glaucous-winged gulls and 3 ^{american} crows, along beach at Swift Bay 18 glaucous-winged gulls, 32 mew gulls, 4 greater yellowlegs, 21 American widgeon, 2 great-blue herons, 13 American crows, 4 bufflehead and 2 surf scoters.

At 1 mi. N Richardson Road, one common raven in field.
