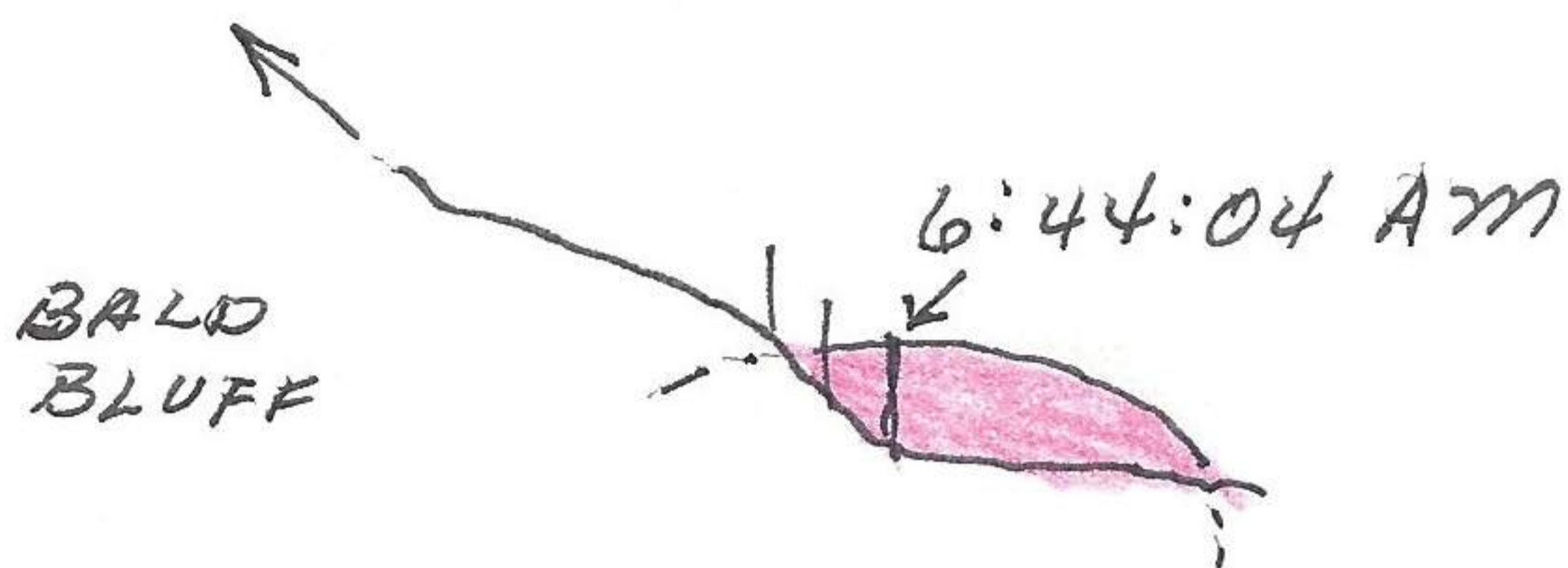

Returned Lopez. Heard common flicker calling (red-shafted race).

March 13, 1988

Sunrise from Bee House at 6:44:04 AM.



Sun (upper edge recurred as it intercepted top tree at notch.

1 river otter swimming S past Bee House. 30' from shore  
Second band-tailed pigeon (Two of them) of this season at feed-er.

at 12:00 P.M. a sailboat no 365 KC displaced 24 double-crested cormorant and 9 harbor seal from Leo Reef. It then went to Little Flower Rock & E Flower Rock and N. Flower Rock and displaced wildlife there. They returned via same route.

March 15, 1988

This A.M. (8:40 AM) larger light colored ♀ (29" at shoulder) and two fawns, 25" and 26" respectively. Young show increase whitish in pelage at posterior body.

To Mt. Vernon. Left Lopez 10:00 A.M. by ferry, will keep complete record of birds enroute. Side ferry:

1 glaucous-winged gull, 1 glaucous winged gull.  
west Thatcher Pass.

1 glaucous-winged gull, 10 glaucous-winged gulls in Armetage Cove, localized on water.

Painter Island. Approx 120 glaucous-winged gulls and equally spaced on island as if on territories.

Middle Rosario Straights. An adult bald eagle flew N 6 feet above water approx. 300 ft east of ferry. The eagle continued N as far as I was able to see.

After day at Mt. Vernon, returned to Lopez
