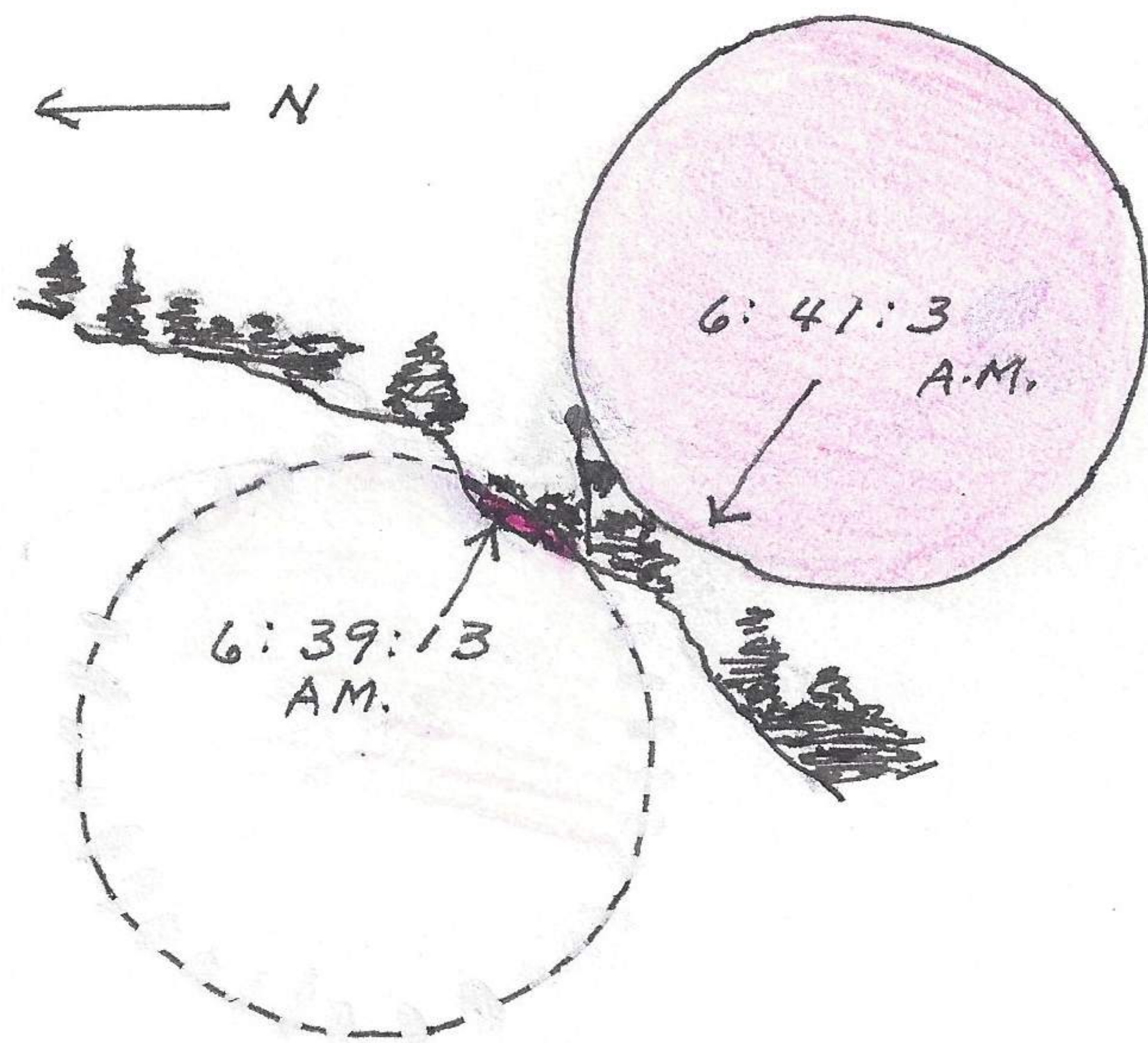


March 16, 1988

880316-1 *Peromyscus m. hollisteri* 180-81-23-20-28gms ♂
From Bee House.

880316-2 green beetle from Bee House.

880316-3 ant from Bee House.

880316-4 Diptera from Bee House.

1:15 P.M. single rook otter swimming and fishing in front Bee House. Diving N and from shore to 30' out into water. First 1/2 dive with air bubble path, then no bubbles, then concentrated bubbles and then finally bubbles - it resurfaced at the edge of the shore to feed on the small fish it had captured.

1:30 P.M. a dark butterfly flew S past Bee House.

2:40 P.M. 2 northern Sea Lion *Eumetopias jubatus* captured salmon approx 200' SE of Bee House in area where fishermen had been successful catching salmon. There was considerable splashing in area with fish being torn apart by the thrashing of seal heads back and forth. The activity lasted 5 minutes with shallow surface diving and commotion in general. They left by diving and as far as I could tell did not resurface for at least 10 minutes. The following birds were attracted to the site; 13 common mergansers, 16 glaucous-winged gull
