After spotting camp left for a short reconnaissance trip until dark! ~~and~~ planned on collecting south along promontory to the prominent Bonnevillie cut ~~terrace~~ on the main west mountain that can be seen from over station on the travertine shore line on the lake. This west mt. promontory is practically devoid of large tree growth or brush but is covered with a dry cheat grass and other small plant growth. The old lake levels are beautifully preserved here and stand out in profile as if they had been used just a year or two ago. This lack of vegetation and coupled with the presence of numerous small boulders, makes for an ideal habitat for the arachnoid group. Several species of spiders were found included among them a dominance of black-widow spider. The wolffs red and black spider was also frequently observed. After leaving camp at 3:23 we arrived at Provo level at 3:36 P.M. 2 Rock wren and 1 jock left level.

3:40 Uta stansburiana among rock on beach of Provo level
 3:41 Wolffs spider in small bush which had a grasshopper in jaws. The spider had clamped one jaw on eye and when released found the eye to be blood shot or reddish where spider had inserted jaw. Naturally a spiders or hoppers blood is not red so assumed that it may have been a chemical reaction from the poison of the spider. Three Uta and 1 sparrow hawk was observed here. The weather to the west looked threatening and was raining and thundering at Moseca on west side of the Lake.

3:50. now following Provo level on west side of promontory. Clear to the east on Wasatch mountains.

3:53. First wind of storm
 4:00 " drop of rain. Have noticed several rabbit diggings near rocks.

4:30 While resting on lee side of rock from the wind and slight rain observed an interesting activity of the *Thysanura* or silver fish. For about 2 minutes a *Thysanura* was observed to be very concerned with the rain drops that intermittently fell upon the
