

that fed on scraps of tissue, some as near as 2 feet away from the seal, 22 mew gulls, 1 common murre, + 2 cormorants. The seal were as large as I have seen (♂'s) and light yellowish brown. The largest had a dark 8" dia. spot on body at top of scapular area. At the same time there were 51 cormorants and 8 harbor seal on Leo Reef.

March 17, 1988

8:40 A.M. a dark ad. ♀ mule deer measuring 30 1/4" at shoulders and her young (28" at shoulders) accompanied the ♀. Both dark pelage.

3:25 P.M. 1 river otter swam & fished as it moved N in front of Bee House.

4:20 P.M. 56 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island and generally distributed. No copulating noticed.

4:30 P.M. Two separate pairs of common raven but in same field SE of junction Baker View and Port Stanley roads. The pairs were performing the same aerial chasing, with the 2 birds of each group always within 1 to 2 feet apart. They flew around the fields at an altitude of 75' high for at least 3 minutes.

5:35 P.M. 1 river otter swam S past Bee House at 30' from shore.

5:40 P.M. Swift Lagoon:

38 pintails

4 mallards

8 green-winged teal

2 shovellers

March 18, 1988
