This evening (10:00 P.M.) at front Bee House, a bat flew back and forth 6 times in rapid straight flight in contrast to slow devious flight of usual bat observed later in season.

April 1, 1988

9:12 A.M. 3 ♂ rufous hummingbirds at feeder at Bee House.

10:10 A.M. an immature bald eagle (lighter brown on back than on wings), flew S along shoreline at approx. 40' high. As it flew over 2 glaucous-winged gulls resting on Flat Point, the gulls left but returned 10-15 seconds later.

In last week I have observed at least 3 bald eagles fly past S of Bee House, along shoreline and around and beyond Licken Point toward Swift Bay. This occurs between 1/2 hour before sunrise to and hour after sunrise. Fewer are observed during other times of the day.
