



7:26 A.M. 2 northern violet green swallows inspected nesting box (SW corner Bee House). At 9:00 A.M. one alighted at entrance of box and then left in 10 seconds.

10: A.M. 13 rufous hummingbirds at Bee House feeders.

1:00 P.M. 3 river otters to S past Bee House.

2:30 P.M. Swift's Lagoon: 8 green-winged teal, 17 pintails, 6 mallards, 11 shovellers. Along Low Bank of Swift's Bay: 27 American widgeon, 4 mallards, 14 glaucous-winged gulls generally feeding on tidal lands, 3 mew gulls, 9 American crows, 8 buffleheads. At Spencer Spit Lagoon: 4 black-bellied plover, 4 hooded mergansers (2♂, 2♀), 8 bufflehead, 4 green-winged teal.

7:50 P.M. 11 rufous hummingbirds at feeder at Bee House. Greatest number at one time earlier this evening, 13.

April 10, 1988

To Anacortes, Lost Lake, and Seattle (UW med. Center for monoclonal antibody imaging program) until next Friday.

Left home on Humphrey Head. At Humphrey Lagoon observed: 6 buffleheads. Left Lopez ferry terminal. Water calm. Observed the following birds: 3 glaucous-winged gulls, 4 pelagic cormorant, 1 western grebe, bald eagle standing on nest in Douglas fir tree on N end Lopez Island (Humphrey Head), 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 western grebe. Approx 175 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island. E end Thatcher Pass. 1 double-crested cormorant middle Rosario Straits. Glaucous-winged gull, Anacortes ferry terminal. Continued to Chris' at Lost Lake, Snohomish Co. In the evening 2 deer, ♀'s, rested, grazed, in open slope E of the house. They arrived from and chewed their cud.
