





First small blue butterfly of season. Another one dark (small),
Common flicker (red-shafted race) call 3 times this A.M. and
has called for a least a week ago. Only 2 gulls have passed
Bee House in last 3 hours.

This A.M. To Chris' and Steves at Lost Lake for hull check on
Grand Banks scheduled for tomorrow morning. First to
Lopez Village and at road just before low beach area of
Swift Bay measured hind foot ^(hoof) of mule deer at 42 mm 
deer of this season. Continued on and finally to  Lopez
ferry landing. while waiting an immature eagle (last
year at least) with 2 missing primary feathers. also 2
band-tailed pigeons flew by. Boarded ferry. no whitecaps
but small waves. at eagle nest on N end Humphrey Head
observed one adult on W side nest facing E and working on some
type of prey.  and  no birds or harbor seal on
Leo Reef. 1/2 usual
number of glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island. W
end Thatcher Pass to E end Thatcher Pass 9 pieces of wood from
3" long pieces to limbs 3" diameter and 9 feet long. Beyond
E end Thatcher 1 double-crested cormorant, 2 double-crest-
ed cormorant. Recent hull slippage to water approx 3/10 mi
N of SW corner of Cypress Island. 1 glaucous-winged gull.
Clouds top Cypress and Mt. Constitution.

April 22, 1988

9:00 A.M. Mr. Anderson came over to Gallery Marine Services
and spent 3 hrs checking hull of Grand Banks. 3 small areas
need replacement, otherwise entire boat O.K. Broker and Seller
to finance repairs. Returned to Lopez Island. no bird census
enroute. Atmospheric haze in San Juans.

April 23, 1988

7:12 A.M. Two adult bald eagles flew 5 past Bee House, to
Lichen Point and beyond.

8:20 A.M. liner otter passed N around Flat Point and pulled
out at Spring Cove for 7 min. covering slope of spring area +
then returned to Cove, past Bee House at 8:29 A.M. It swam
alternately over and under water without stopping to feed.

4 western grebes, one ♀ Pacific loon? and 2 Common loon
(in summer plumage) in area between ^{Spring} Cove & Leo Reef.
