 been seen in water than on the Leo Reef.

6:30 P.M. 1 river otter to N past Bee House.

7:10 P.M. 2 river otter to N past Bee House

Earlier today (approx 7:30 A.M. a ♀ mule deer (30 1/4" at shoulder  
 and 12 other deer in feeder area at one time.

This afternoon at 4:05 P.M. noted 6 turkey vultures in one  
 group above 1917 School House about 100' above ground.

Also at Swifts Logom noted: 4 pintails, 11 green-winged  
 teal, 4 mallards, 2 greater yellowlegs.

At Bee House noted a Bonaparte gull for first time this  
 season.

This evening at dusk single Tyme, a mule deer 33" at  
 shoulders fed at deer feeder. Its antlers  
 were slightly curved to rear

 from Blakely Island. At this time water in sound calm  
 and observed birds on water in groups of 3-2-8-6-2-4<sup>total 24</sup> between
