

April 29, 1988

From Mt. Vernon Thousand Trails Preserve to Dr. Johnson at Mt. Vernon for removal of last 2 nodules (melanoma) on forehead, thence back to Lopez Island.

April 30, 1988

7:48 A.M. mamma deer's surviving twin a ♂ at feeder and measured 27 1/2" at shoulder

3:10 A.M. 1 river otter passed Bee House swimming north and 1 at some time rounded Flat Point going south. The latter put-out at Lichen Point and ascended intertidal zone to high tide level where it turned around, faced the water and discharged urine at an object in 5 ridged and stiff pumping action of the hind quarters (up & down) and then returned to the water and continued S around Lichen Point.

6:30 P.M. 1 river otter swam N past Bee House at 20' from shore.

Only 2 rufous hummingbirds observed at feeders today.

May 1, 1988

7:30 A.M. two bald eagles <sup>one</sup> chasing the other in undulating flight from S to N past Bee House.

7:35 A.M. harbor seal in front of Bee House, 40' from shore.

9:00 A.M. no harbor seal on Leo Reef but 7 on Little Flower Rocks.

A trawler fished in front of Bee House no <sup>"Andante"</sup> UN 4526 GB. Get kind of boat as it had exceptional good features about it.

May 2, 1988

When mule deer, in this case an adult female, observe a moving object they turn their head in degrees, <sup>rather</sup> than in one continuous sweep. Noted one deer, after observing a moving object, approached feeding area at Bee House accentuated high steps and tail perpendicular.

Trip to Lopez Village. at E side Fishermans Bay S of Island-er docks and approx. 150' from shore were 72 ♀ and 4 ♂ buffleheads in one group. On W side peninsula (causeway) noted 34 ♀ and 2 ♂ buffleheads (in sound), 8 horned grebe in summer plumage, 2 surf scoters, 1 great blue heron. 18 ♀, 2 ♂
