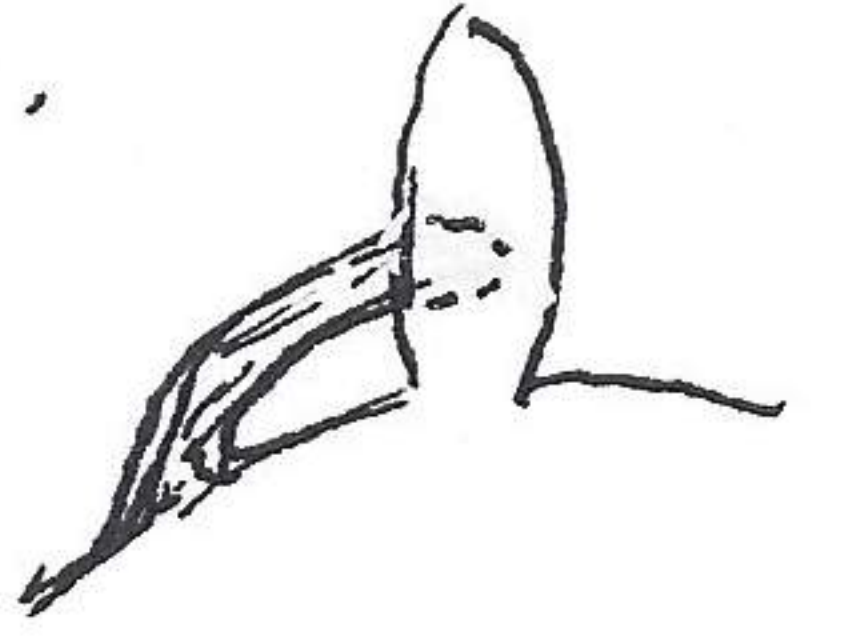


6:35 single Tyne mule deer at feeder at Bee House

3" dark mark of window at 9:20 P.M.



James R. and I May 6, 1988
Left Lopez Island for Union Lake to finalize
purchase 32 Grand Banks. "The Bee". Left ferry terminal 10:10 A.M.
2 pelagic cormorants. 5 side Cypress Island, glaucous-
winged gull. Arrived Anacortes 10:50 P.M. This crossing
from Lopez to Anacortes had fewer birds than I have seen on
same route. water only slightly agitated.

May 7, 1988
Back to Union Lake from Chris' home at Last Lake,
more administration and work on motor & hull, by James R. and I

May 8, 1988
Union Lake. In afternoon Chris, Jay & I met mother at
Anacortes ferry docks and then drove to La Conner where
we had Mother's Day dinner, then back to Anacortes where
mother returned to Lopez & we returned to Last Lake.
Adult bald eagle 1/10 mi. W of Swinomish Bridge (route 20)
On return to Last Lake and at Conway turnoff from Interstate 5.

May 9, 1988
Continued working on the Grand Banks. Changed oil at
hours 2576.0. James R. did nearly all the work in the bilge area.

May 10, 1988
Returned from Union Lake to Lopez. James R. continued working on
the boat.

May 11, 1988
To Mt. Vernon for removal of 7th melanoma nodule. Left 7:40 A.M. on
ferry. Enroute groups of 6, 2, 2, 1 marbled murrelets in Rosario
Straights. 11 groups of glaucous-winged gulls as singles or pairs,
all in air, and generally distributed. Oil on water N of
Anacortes ferry terminal and Coast Guard cleaning beaches to
W of terminal from tanker oil spill a few weeks ago. The
oil originally sank to bottom but is now surfacing. Arrived
8:21 A.M. Continued to Mt. Vernon for surgery and then
return to Anacortes ferry terminal. Left for Lopez 3:45 P.M.
Enroute observed 3 Bonaparte gulls, 1 marbled murrelet, 1 Bonaparte
