

May 17, 1988

11:21 AM 17 harbor seal Les Reef, 4 on Les Reef Rock no 10; 12 on Little Flower Rock and 3 on Big Flower Rock.

2:15 P.M. 25 band-tailed pigeons on front porch feeding station,

Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Washington.

May 18, 1988

8:05 A.M. Townsend chipmunk jumped from side of Douglas Fir onto neck of a mule deer which was feeding at the feeder. Both animals reacted with surprise. Also this morning an Eastern gray squirrel jumped to rim of feeder when a mule deer was in the act of feeding out of the same feeder (8" from head of deer). The squirrel remained, the deer left.

11:01 red-tailed hawk circle S past Bee House at 70' above water.

In last 2 days at least there are times when there are no aquatic birds in area between Bee House & Les Reef.

2:33 P.M. 37 harbor seal (22 light, 15 dark) on Les Reef. Only seal in area.

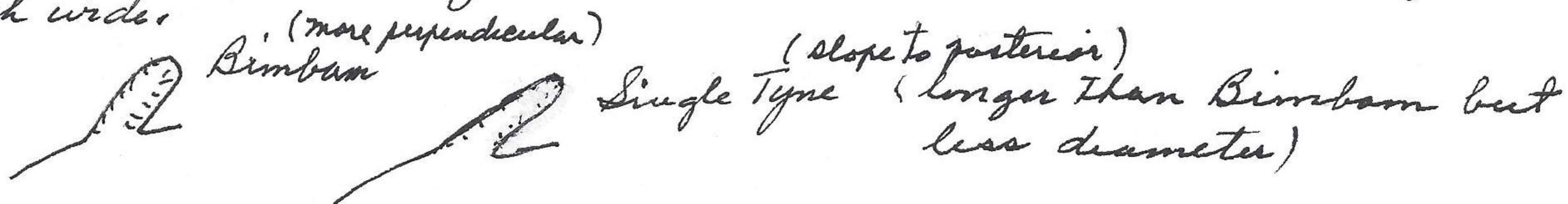
violet-green swallows enters nesting box on an overage of once per hour.

Band-tailed pigeons at feeder, at intervals both morning and afternoon, averaging 28 in flock. Crows feed compatibly with pigeons.

May 19, 1988

Birds absent from sound before sunrise, then mainly 5-6 Glaucous-winged gulls and an occasional double-crested cormorant.

13:10 P.M. Bimbam, a mule deer, at feeder. Larger bucks generally feed at feeder in evenings. 33" at shoulders. Antlers 3" long and 1 inch wide.



Band-tailed pigeons feed at Bee House feeder on the overage of three times a day, morning, noon and early evening. 33 today in one flock.

9:30 P.M. a bat (medium size myotis) flew back and forth in front of Bee House (2nd floor, SE exposure and facing water) for 25 min. and then only once every half hour or so to at least 10:45 P.M.
