10:10 A.M. Left Lopez Island for Anacortes. Bald eagle on nest, low profile. no harbor seal on Leo Reef. Glaucous-



winged gulls on territories of Flower Island. no birds up to W end Thatcher Pass. Glaucous-winged gull. E end Thatcher Pass. double-crested cormorant, glaucous-winged gull, glaucous-winged gull, glaucous-winged gull, all flying W. At Middle Rosario Straits 180 glaucous-winged gulls, 12 common murrelets, 2 rhinoceros auklets, and 25 other alcids in close-ordered pod to S, fishing.

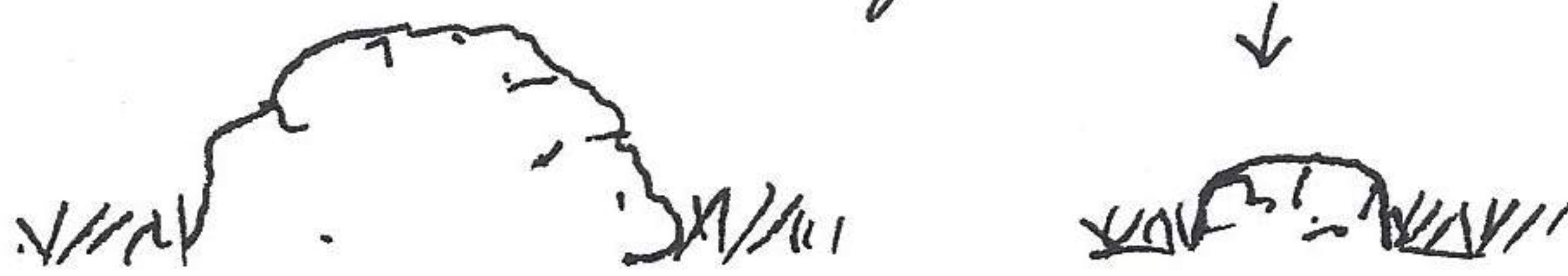
5:20 P.M. Anacortes ferry terminal on return trip to Lopez Island. In the ship harbor to S of Anacortes ferry terminal, noted 51 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 great blue heron, 3 pigeon guillemots. Left 5:21 P.M. 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 2 pigeon guillemots, 2 pigeon guillemots, 1 glaucous-winged gull, 1 pigeon guillemot, 2 glaucous-winged gulls flying SW, 1 glaucous-winged gull flying NE, 1 glaucous-winged gull on water. Middle Rosario Straits. 1 pigeon guillemot flying NE, 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 3 marbled murrelets, 1 common murre. E Thatcher Pass, 9 pigeon guillemots flying on group NE. W end Thatcher Pass. 1 glaucous-winged gull to S, 8 glaucous-winged gulls on piling at Lopez Island ferry terminal. Arrived Lopez Island 5:56 P.M.

6:01. 1 river otter S past Bee House making a broad short cut to Lichen Point.

May 25, 1988

11:30 A.M. Annette observed the first fawn of the season. It was crossing the Port Stanley Road SW of Swift's Lagoon. with its mother.

1:20 P.M. Buster, a mule deer at Bee House feeder. The larger wartlike knobs on shoulder blade area and upper right leg were now approx. 8 mm wide. They had either been broken off or reduced.



7:01 P.M. Bimbam, a mule deer at feeder at Bee House. The antlers are approx 1 inch less than length of ear when ear parallels antler. Right antler with nub for tine point.
