Height of forelimb at scapula is 33".

Antler approx. 5" long. Left antler 1" longer.

Curves up and laterally

Dark-eyed junco (Oregon race) feeding 2 young at feeder.

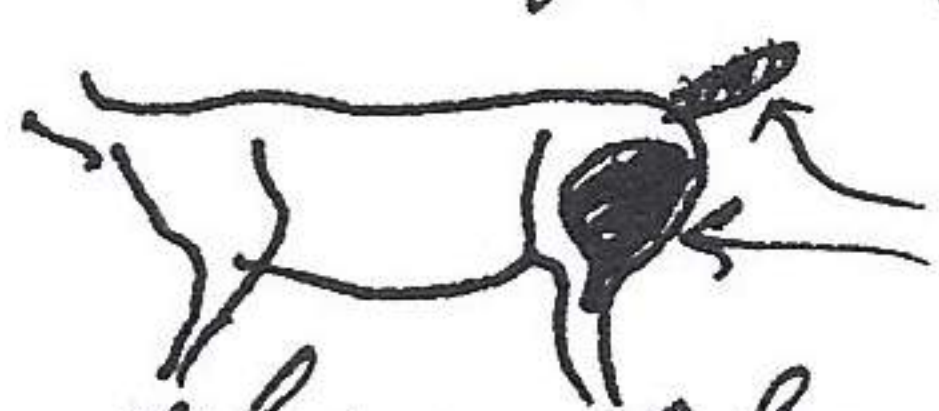
This afternoon observed an American Crow fly from Bee House to Leo Reef.

An average of 32 band-tailed pigeons at feeder, on and off from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. When all birds leave feeder at once there are 4-6 small feathers displaced and in the air above the feeder. When 32 birds are on feeder, (approx. 7 sq. feet) the birds are so closely packed that when another bird lands it rests and then slides off side or back + tail of the bird already on the feeder. Many instances of upstretched necks and pecking of challenging birds. Wing slapping common. Both defensive mannerisms given approx 1 per every 2 seconds. Otherwise the pigeons are compatible.

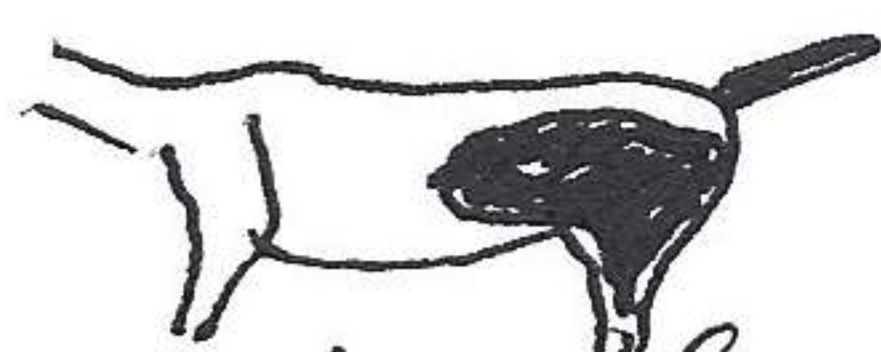
43 mallards, in Swift Lagoon. They left for pond 1/10 mi. to S. and 2 blue-winged teal

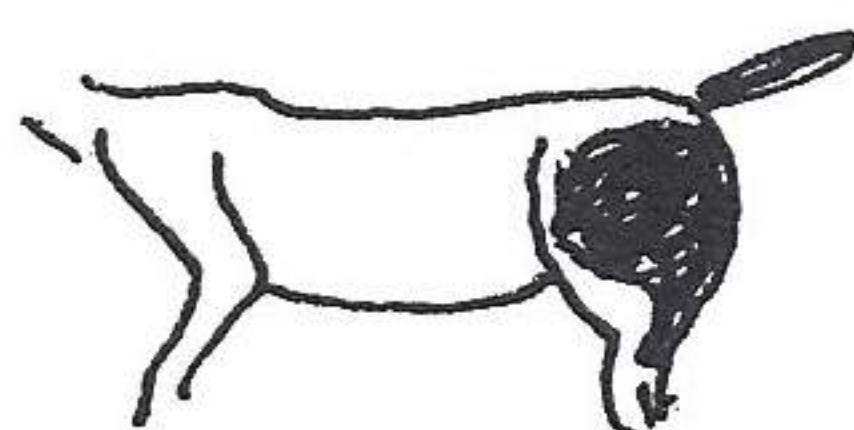
11:05 A.M. 2 ♂ and 1 ♀ of last years ^{mule deer} young. One ♂, 30" high at shoulders, blond and ragged faded winter pelage. New golden brown hair long. Antler 3/4 diameter and 1" long.



Another ♂ darker tan than above, new hair; antlers 3/4" x 1" long.



The female darker grayish brown and new pelage a darker golden brown than above.



An eastern gray squirrel approach deer to 16" and white deer responded carelessly they remained at the feeder and the challenger backed away.

11:30 A.M. 28 harbor seal (9 of which are black) on Leo Reef proper (beacon rocks). No other seal on Flower rocks or Leo Reef rocks no. 10, 11, rock no 9 not exposed.

72 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island, 90% in pairs on territories.

12:30 P.M. 4 ♂ goldfinch, 3 ♂ purple finch on lawn at pharmacy building along Fishermans Bay.

1:00 P.M. bald eagle at Cross and Port Stanley roads, one at 1917 School House.
