

June 4, 1988

In area of above map observed:

4 black oystercatchers, these birds were herded along beach for 100' at 25' distance; 4 double-crested cormorants, 1 rufous-sided towhee, 1 song sparrow; 6 American crows; 9 glaucous-winged gulls; 1 kingfisher (belted); 4 barn swallow; 8 violet-green swallow; 1 great blue heron.

Left Thousand Trails Preserve and drove to Anacortes ferry dock. Birds there: 12 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 cedar waxwing, 9 mallards, 8 barn swallows, 4 American crows, 2 white-crowned sparrows. Tide out to last piling in bay SW of terminal.

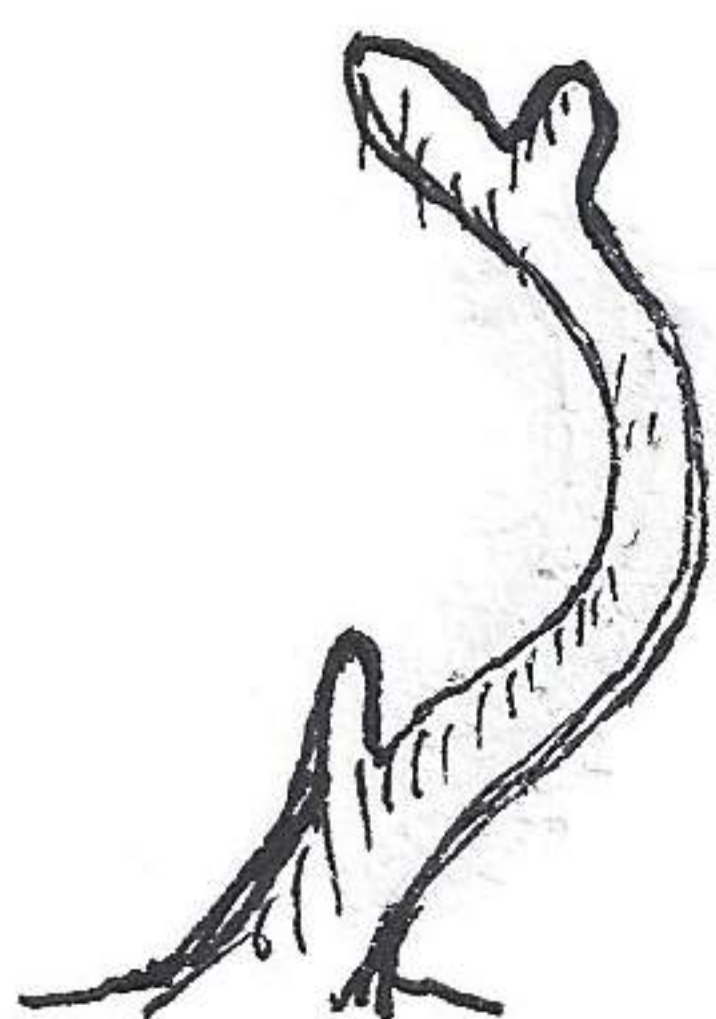
Left on ferry 3:45 P.M. Enroute to Lopez Island only 1 double-crested cormorant and 2 glaucous-winged gulls and these in Rosario Straits. As we passed N end of Humphrey Head noted a bald eagle standing on nest. Arrived Lopez Island.
