Buster, a mule deer measured 31" at shoulders

At Lopez Village on Lopez Island noted 2 bald eagles circling above ridge to E.

5:25 P.M. 1 river otter to N past Bee House.

June 8, 1988

6:55 A.M. 1 river otter to S 18' out from shoreline below Bee House.

In last 4 days mule deer 2-3 have been lying on Boundary Point part of the day. (A.M. or P.M.) for 2-4 hours including 1 year ♂, ♀ and ad. ♀♀'s.

8:10 A.M. ♂, 30" high at shoulders at Bee feeder, new summer pelage except lower neck

4:25 P.M. medium size harbor seal (spotted) fished successfully for candle fish for 5 minutes in front Bee House from 5' to 30' from shore, keeping on or just under (6" or so) water. Sometimes ^(1/2 time) it would swim on back and capture fish while in that position.

Kingfisher caught 2 candlefish in same area as above.

A male mule deer at Bee feeder. It measured 30 1/2" high at shoulders, one antler (right) 1", left antler 1 1/2".

June 9, 1988

8:30 A.M. Buster, a mule deer, had blood on posterior body.

9:10 after feeding and grooming she (Buster) laid on ramp of feeder approach for 15 minutes.
