The lop-eared ♀ mule deer, 31" high at shoulders at Bee feeder. She had one of her two fawns at feeder. The fawn measured 17 1/2" high. This fawn is at least 3 weeks old.

June 12, 1988

10:00 A.M. 11 Harbor seal on Leo Reef, 5 on Little Flower Rock and 12 on North Flower Rock.

12:00 A.M. 4 of the renters (O'Leary house) took boat to Leo Reef and displaced the harbor seal and then returned to O'Leary home. While they were there (the renters) the seal all left at the same time and as far as I could see, the seal<sup>(8)</sup> did not reappear until 4 minutes later some 150' N of the reef.

June 13, 1988


8:00 A.M. Sister, a mule deer at feeder and measured 28" at shoulders.

Trip to Fishermans Bay. 4 white butterflies (only ones observed) enroute (Port Stanley, Hummel Lake route)


Drove to Causeway, SW side Fishermans Bay. Counted glaucous-winged gulls in 7/10 miles of causeway on low tide edge of beach (groups) 5, 7, 5, 1, 2, 4, 8, 10, 8, 1, 3, 5. Also feeding with gulls and generally distributed were 16 American Crows. On E side causeway in mud flats and small standing pools were 8 great blue herons.

The following deer show change of antler growth since previous recorded:

left antler 1/4" shorter than right

♂  30" high at shoulders.

♂  shoulder height? ♀ 31 1/2" high at shoulders and the aggressive one.
