




A log, curved and with projecting roots  has been in Spring Cove for at least 2 1/2 years and roots has anchored the log in gravel of beach on out movement of water. It has also kept other logs hemmed in on beach. Today cut roots from log and next high tide took it out of bay and moved it into sound. Logs with limbs also become attached to beach  Curved logs also are difficult for tides to remove from beach: .

June 18, 1988

after breakfast at Bothell, visited city park along Sammish River. at one angle of river, along edge for 150', a large swallow-tailed butterfly flew along edge of river and made 3 definite angle turns.

June 20, 1988

Left Chris' at Last Lake and returned to Lopez Island. Left Anacortes ferry terminal at 3:40 P.M. nine glaucous-winged gulls at boat, 28 on piling in bay to SW. Enroute 1 glaucous-winged gull, 1 mottled murrelet, 1 glaucous-winged gull. 3 glaucous-winged gulls n James Island. at w end Thatcher Pass, 1 pigeon guillemot, 1 glaucous-winged gull. Arrived Lopez Island.

In last two weeks there has been more debris (fragments of sea vegetation and logs) than earlier in summer.

June 21, 1988

4:31 A.M. bald eagle flew S in front Bee House. I have not seen as many eagles in last 2 weeks in comparison to earlier
