

Hatcher Pass, glaucous-winged gull, pigeon guillemot, marbled murrelet, glaucous-winged gull. On a log raft N of Ferry terminal at Anacortes, 38 glaucous-winged gulls. Arrived Anacortes.

Returned Lopez Island 5:25 P.M. (departed Anacortes) 2 single marbled murrelets, glaucous-winged gull. N Humphrey Head glaucous-winged gull. At Lopez Island ferry dock, 21 glaucous-winged gulls on piling (2 of them juveniles).

Have not observed river otter since last recorded in journal.

Large buck mule deer at feeder at 11:45 A.M. (34" high, no tines (eye)).

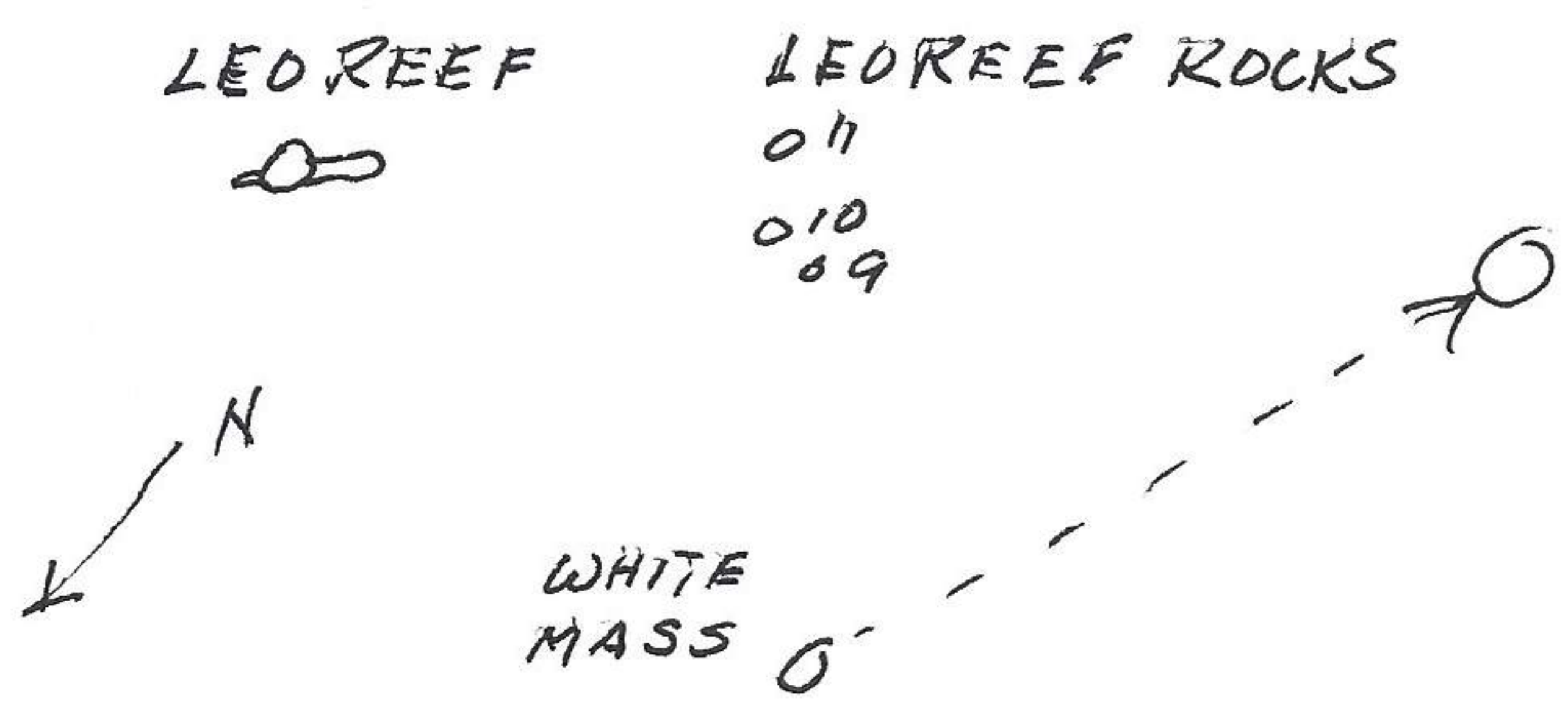

This morning between 7 and 9 A.M. white mass (approx 20' diameter) moved from 200' N Leo Reef Rocks no 9, 10, 11 to 1/10 mi. to south. Carried by currents travelling S. Wind from S.



7: June 27, 1988

7:30 AM male mule deer, 33" high at shoulders, at Bee feeder. antlers similar in size to <sup>large</sup> ♂ mule deer figured on June 22 date, except right antler with 1" tine. This ♂ is slightly smaller than one referred to immediately above. Left front point <sup>left</sup> shows <sup>no</sup> beginning of second bifurcation.

Another ♂ mule deer, 34" at shoulder, no tines and first front left point with beginning of bifurcation not present when observed June 22 (see journal). Although buck buck were together, each fed at the feeder alone. After feeding the stand
