

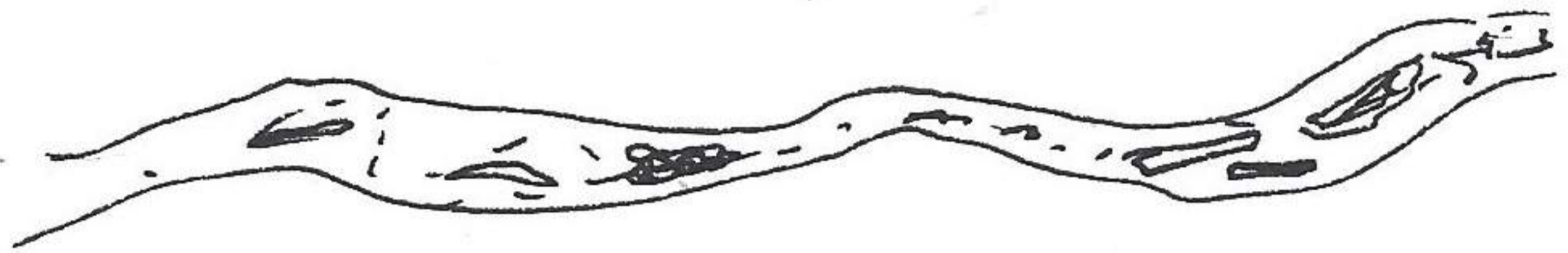
7:20 A.M. Ad. bald eagle flew S past Bee House to Lichen Point, thence SE to Frost Island. As it passed over Flower Island at approx 200', all gulls left the island and flew  $\frac{2}{10}$  mile E then returned and immediately settled down.

9:10 A.M. Two harbor seal swam by Bee House at approx. 35' from shore. They continued 50' and then dove not to reappear in our area.

4:50 P.M. Single harbor seal swam out from Boundary Point some 50'.

For the last week, dead leaves of the madrona have been falling.

Noted that logs and debris follow tidal currents



Have not observed river otter since last recorded in journal.

Band-tailed pigeons are noted (for last month) on the average of 1 per every 4 days. Prior to that time they occurred in large flocks of 10-20 birds. See journal.

July 8, 1988

To Anacortes. No bald eagle on <sup>nest</sup> at N end Humphrey Head. Osprey flew over Frost Island to Thatcher and beyond toward Spencer Lake.

6 harbor seal on N side Leo Reef.

Osprey flew NE over Frost Island to Blakely Island.

Marbled murrelet W end Thatcher Pass

Blaucous-winged gull, 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 4 glaucous-winged gulls.

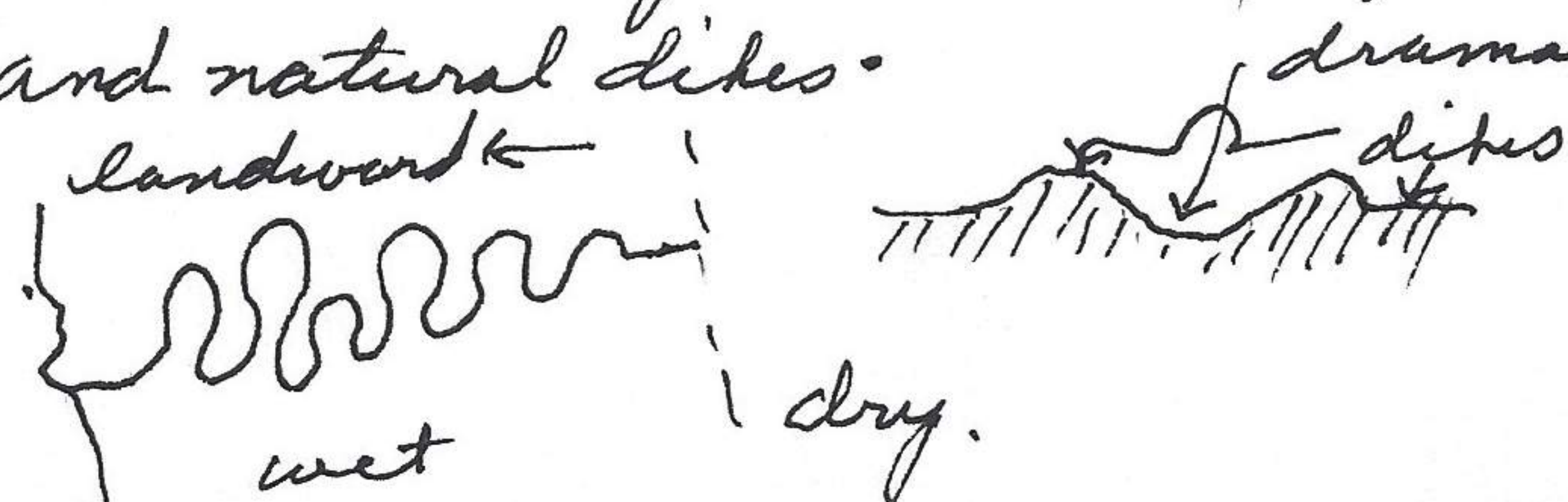
2 groups (6 and 4) of marbled murrelets.

Arrived Anacortes,

at City Park <sup>on lawn</sup> along banks of Skagit River N mt. Vernon, 28 mew gulls and 3 glaucous-winged gulls.

Returned to Anacortes.

In west (SW) end bay (W March Point Peninsula) noted outer 100' to 150' of tidal land wet from land drainage, beyond is dry at low tide. Drainage channel exceptionally developed into meanders and natural dikes.



Tidal lands are green in spring & summer.
