Don Jensen report 5 young otter at Blue Ford on Hunter  
Bay area, Lopez Island,

Listed use of Spring Cove (Community property) and  
shoreline in general.

1. No trees or shrubs to be cut.
2. Single stairway to beginning of shoreline
3. No permanent structures as tables, chairs, barbecue pits,  
wind breakers, fireplaces, recreation equipment etc.
4. No modification of beach or contact with slope
5. No boat docks, moorage or bays
6. Driftwood remains in position & is not removed.
7. maintain natural flow of spring seepage
8. chairs & tables temporarily used for comfort and picnics
9. all trash and debris removed from shoreline.
10. Earphone music only.
11. no wood fires.
12. Enjoy as natural area and not used for recreation.
13. Normal conversation
14. no dogs
15. no rock climbing on N side Spring Cove.
16. no boat storage or buoy moorage.
17. Do not transgress on intertidal zones of animal and  
plant communities or vegetation <sup>on and</sup> above shoreline except by trail.
