

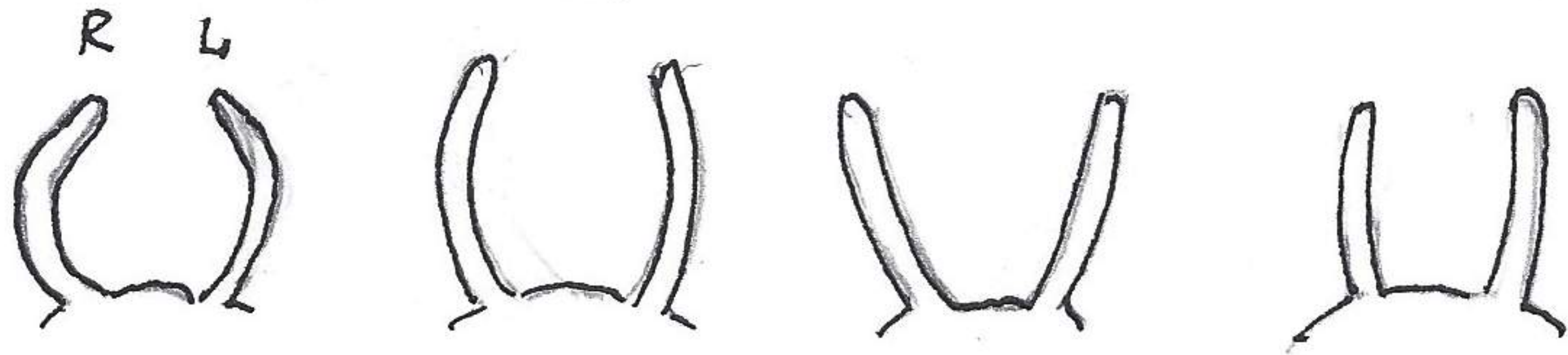
Rufous hummingbirds left Humphrey Head area one week ago on July 16, 1988. and they have not been observed since. The hummingbird feeder remains at same sugar-water level indicating the birds have not been in area.

Bonaparte gulls appeared regularly at Bee House as singles on July 19, 1988.

July 28, 1988

There are three mule deer that are commonly seen together:




A female mule deer 30" high at shoulder is dominant over all four males above and also fawns.


Another ♀ mule deer 30" high is aggressive over all ♂ above and other females.

Right and left designations are according to deers right & left position. not as observed looking straight at the deer.

July 29, 1988

To Oreas Island via ferry. ^{are} Madrona leaves in masses of ^{floating} vegetation in all of Harney Channel . They also occur as single leaves generally dispersed.

8 Glaucous-winged gull at Shaw ferry terminal, 2 of them on nests on top of piling bundles 

Between Shaw Island and Oreas Island an American Crow landed on railing of lower car deck at front of ferry and rode for 3 minutes then left.

July 30, 1988

To Bee, a Grand Banks boat. At 4:05 P.M. an osprey hovered three times in 5th part Shoal Bay at near shoreline. On the 4th hover it dropped to water 30' from shore and picked up a fish 11" long. It flew N over marina, thence S against conifer sidehill gradually gaining altitude and finally
