

passed E over ridge and thence E, gaining altitude, to Blakely Island. As it passed over the ridge an adult bald eagle came from the SW and followed the osprey for about 1/10 mi. then returned to a perch on top of a conifer. SW of Humphrey Lagoon.

at the Bee, caught a dogfish 24" long in 20' of water, also 2 8" catfishlike fish.

Aug 1, 1988

880801-1 *Peromyscus m. hollisteri* [100]-[0]-24-19gms ♀  
From Bee House. Tail completely sealed over.

A ♀ mule deer was standing on an 8x4 plywood and when startled adjusted feet on board with a loud firm sound indicating great pressure of feet on the board. It did not move forward but was preparing for forward fleeing.

A fawn mule deer (the one with abscessed jaw) called like a cat every 3 seconds for 9 times as it came in 110 feet to the feeder where other deer were feeding. It opened its mouth each time the call was given.

Aug 3, 1988

Sun up 6:12 A.M. water perfect reflection of background. For at least 1/2 hr prior to sunrise, 58 fish surfaced directly E of Bee House in middle 1/3 of N Lopez Sound in an area of 15x binocular. At sunup a boat passed S along E shore and waves took 13 minutes to reach the Bee House and during that time the fish <sup>momentarily</sup> stopped their activity. There were 4 seal (harbor) 1-1-2 in area of fish activity. There were no harbor seal on Leo Reef at that time. At 6:28 A.M. fish activity stopped. At that same time 1 Bonaparte gull and 2 mottled murrelets arrive and were the only birds observed up to that time.

This morning <sup>directly</sup> to Friday Harbor, <sup>by ferry.</sup> Birds observed:  
1 Bonaparte gull, 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 11 Bonaparte gulls, 18 glaucous-winged gulls in middle San Juan Channel, 1 double-crested cormorant, 28 glaucous-winged gulls and 5 Bonaparte gulls at green beam to S., Bonaparte gull, 5 Bonaparte gulls, 1 Bonaparte gull, arrived Friday Harbor.
