1 glaucous-winged gull, 3 glaucous-winged gulls.  
Wasp Passage. 1 Bonaparte gull, 1 Bonaparte gull, 2 glaucous-winged gulls, 1 Bonaparte gull, 1 glaucous-winged gull, 1 Bonaparte gull.

E end Wasp Passage. Bonaparte gull. Adult bald eagle flew SW in middle channel SW Oreas ferry landing.

Oreas. glaucous-winged gull.

Shaw. 4 glaucous-winged gulls, 8 Bonaparte gulls, 38 Bonaparte gulls on group, 15 Bonaparte gulls.

NE end Shaw Island. 2 Bonaparte gulls, groups of 3-2-1 Bonaparte gulls.

Arrived Lopez Island.

At Bee House 13 Bonaparte gulls flew by. There is a definite increase in Bonaparte gulls in this area of an almost lack of these gulls this summer.

Aug. 4, 1988

This morning and afternoon, approx. 150 Bonaparte gulls in area front Bee House out <sup>to</sup> 200 feet in flight or on water and in loose aggregates. Populations vary from day to day.

Aug 5, 1988

4:20 P.M. 53 American crows in loose aggregate flew S out 200'-300' E of Bee House and 150'-250' high. They flew consistently S over Leo Reef, Frost Island and beyond. I have not seen this flight pattern before.

Last week a single, rather tame, band-tailed pigeon visited (average 3 times a day) the front feeder. It is approx 80% tamer than the regular flock of 5-15 birds that visit the feeder on an average of every 3 days.
