


at 'The Bee', waves from ferry boats 1 mi to N, take 22 min. to arrive causing the Grand Banks to list up to 14°.

Back at Bee House measure one of this years fawn ^{mule deer} as 24" high at shoulders. [at the Bee caught 2 spiny daffish 18 and 26" long and a true cod 8" in length, both standard measurements]

Aug. 23, 1988

To Anacortes by ferry. Complete census. 3 harbor seal on Leo Reef and 18 glaucous-winged gulls. 6 glaucous-winged gulls on Flower Island.

Return to Lopez Island by ferry. At terminal in marsh area to SW noted 1 ♀ yellow-headed blackbird. also in same area, 1 great blue heron, 20 barn swallows, 5 gold finch, 19 glaucous-winged gulls (on piling), 8 mew gulls (on piling), 4 starling, 3 double crested cormorant, 3 American crows.  yellow. At 8:45 P.M. in same area 5 flocks of ducks sp.?, flew E averaging 25 birds per flock. no record of birds on return trip.

Aug 25, 1988

From Bee House (basement).

11:00 A.M. approx 2,000 mew gulls in 6 groups on outer edge tidal flats (low tide).

Aug. 26, 1988

To mt. Baker for 3 days. Left Lopez Island ferry terminal in Barth motor home at 1:32 P.M. Will keep complete record to Anacortes. mew gull, mew gull w Thatcher Pass. Bonaparte gull. Painter Islands with full number of glaucous-winged gulls on territories?, mew gull, marbled murrelet.

Continued to Silver Fir Camp and stayed overnight there.

Aug 27, 1988

From Silver Fir Camp. to Picture Lake to Painters Point at end of road. at Painters Point the ranger reported a ♀ and 2 cub black bears on E end of ridge bordering
