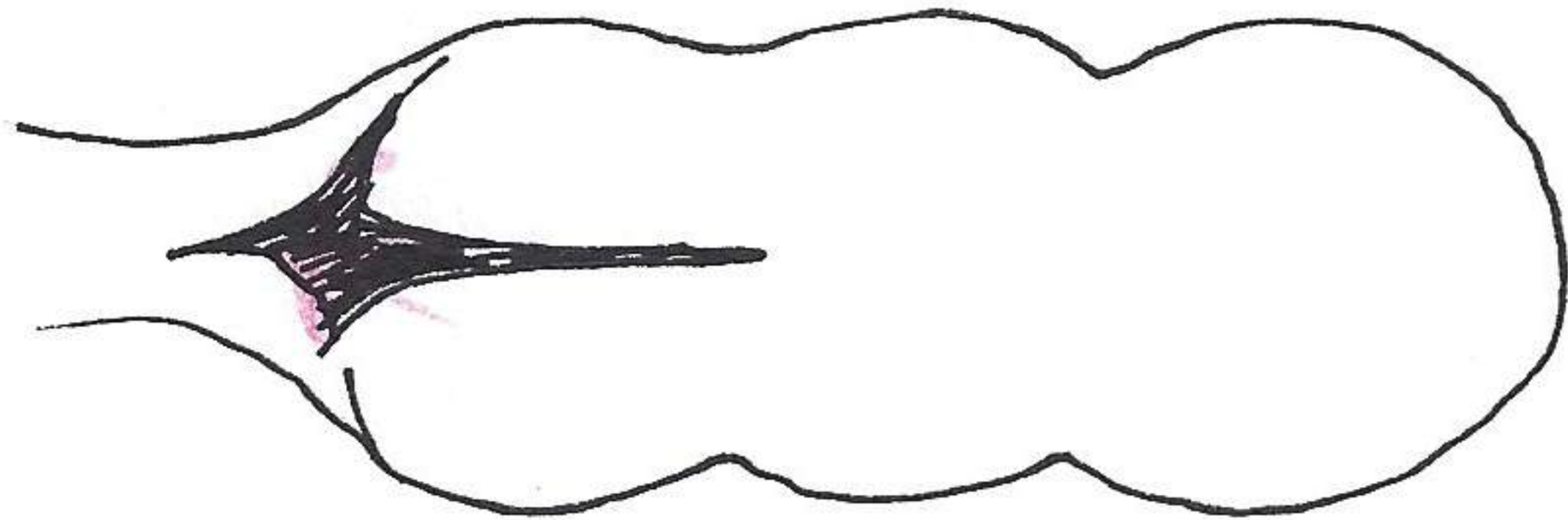
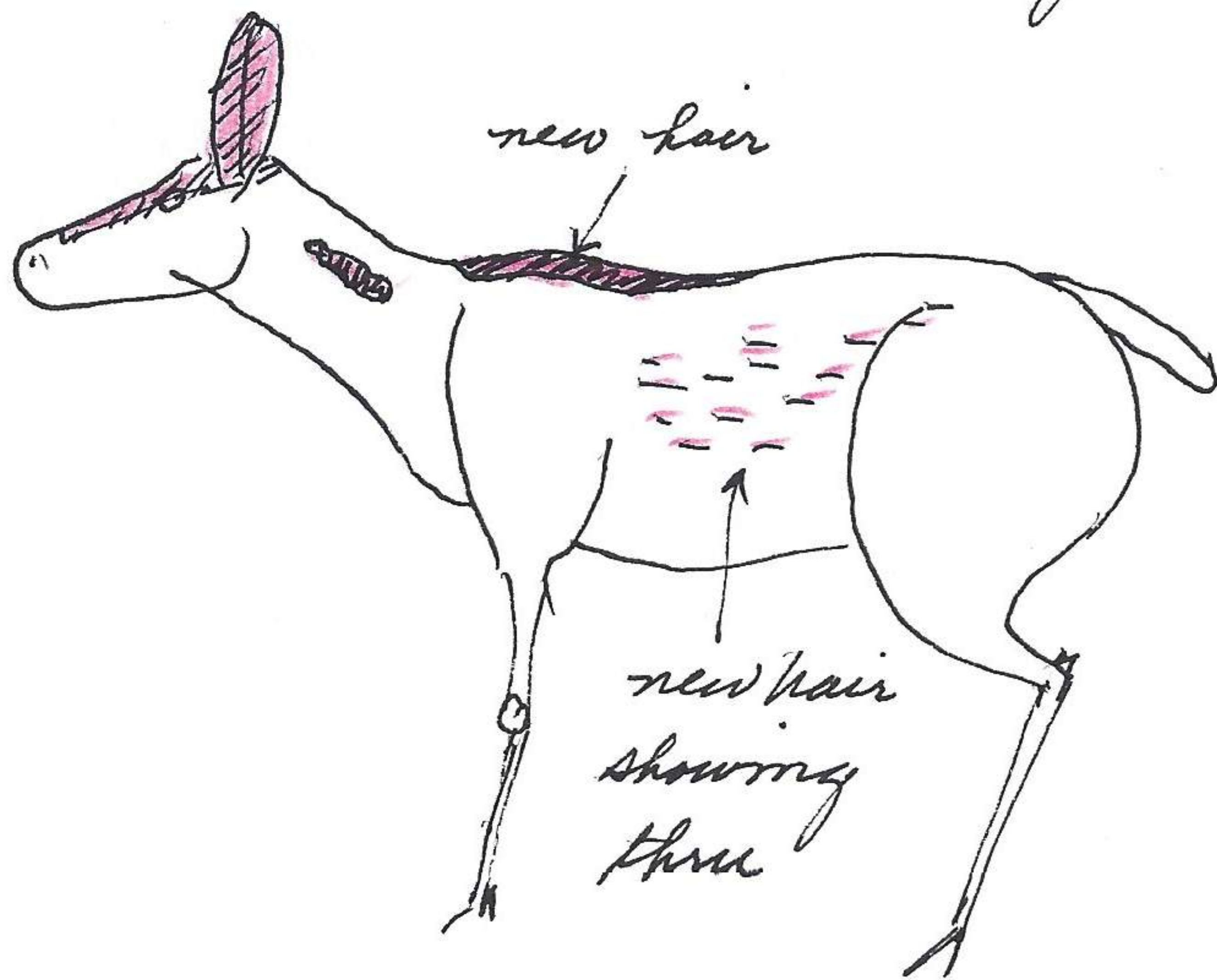


approached the swallow nesting box, it would make a circle in front of it (3' diameter) It is in-
