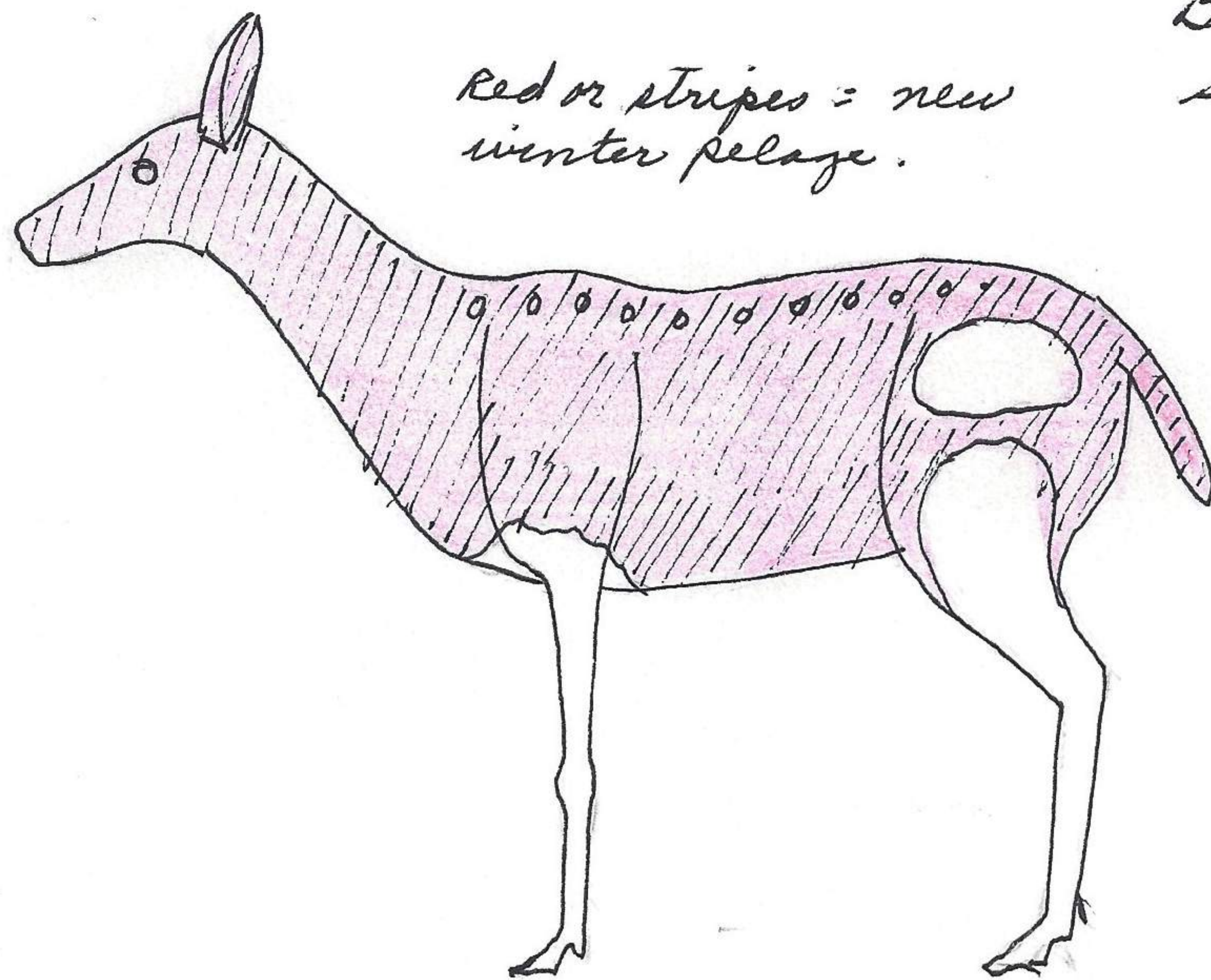


Bee Estate, Humphrey Head, Lopez Island, San Juan Co., Washington  
 Sept. 17, 1988



Red or stripes = new  
 winter pelage.

Buster, a mule deer, ♀.  
 She has dots along  
 each side medial  
 line.

Her fawn, 24 1/4"  
 high at shoulders  
 has complete winter  
 pelage and like  
 its mother has  
 dots along medial  
 line but pelage  
 lighter (golden-brown)  
 than dark grey fe-  
 male.

a ♀ mule deer 29" high at shoulder with complete winter pelage.

a ♀ mule deer 25 1/2" high at shoulder with complete winter  
 pelage.

A spiked ♂ mule deer (the male featured on Sept 15, 1988  
 notes) smelled the air with mouth open as do bucks later  
 in rutting season. The ♀ adult deer are definitely more  
 nervous and aggressive than in summer.

Sept 18, 1988

An adult ♀ mule deer, 28 1/2" high at shoulder, with  
 complete winter pelage. It is difficult to judge if lower  
 limbs and post-ocular patch are, in fact, in winter pelage.

A ♀ mule deer 28 1/2 inches high at shoulders, is in  
 this pelage change:
