

880918-1 Peromyscus maniculatus hollisteri 172-81-22-18-18gms ♂
testis 7mm. From Bee House.

7:15 A.M. 2 marbled murrelets swam 5 in front of Bee House some 20'-30' from shore. They swam underwater for approx 50' then surfaced together for 30 seconds and then dove again to repeat their 50' underwater spans. At each surfacing 3 Bonaparte gulls flew to their point of emergence (within 3-6").

Buster, a ♀ mule deer has same pelage as of Sept 17, 1988. but dorsal rump replaced with new winter pelage.

2:00 P.M. 12 harbor seal on Leo Rock no 4, 9 on Leo Rock no 5, 5 double-crested cormorants and 3 glaucous-winged gulls on Leo Rock no 6.

A common loon fed in front of Bee House (40-50') for 1/2 hour. When bobbing it flapped wings on water and moved each time some 8' or so, then raised its body and flapped its wing in an upright position.

6:00 P.M. Strongest wind this summer (from S) with waves 10' interval and 1 1/2' high. Waves 23 per minute. White caps.

Sept 19, 1988

To Anacortes. no census. 1 bright yellow tree 80' W of power line and N end Pelator Island. Some sign of yellow in trees and shrubs 100 or so feet W of this tree. Otherwise no fall color in trees on slope at least when viewed from ferry.

Spent night at Thousand Trails. The salmon pens off Lone Tree Point and the recreational facilities now occupying the foreground of the lodge has destroyed the scenic value of this once beautiful peninsula and sound beyond.

Sept. 20, 1988

Left Thousand Trails and drove to Anacortes ferry terminal. A mourning dove flew over terminal. while waiting loading of ferry observed from rear of ferry: (all flying E). Bonaparte gull, double-crested cormorant, 2 individual glaucous-winged gulls, 2 ducks (sp), 3 single glaucous-winged gulls, double-crested cormorant, Bonaparte gull, glaucous-winged gull.

Left terminal on ferry at 5:27 P.M. Will keep complete census.
